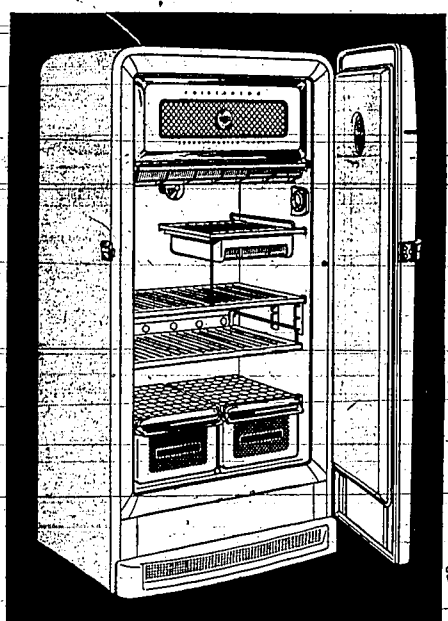
Test Finished on New Project Well

SURETY, April 26—A bureau of reclamation engineer on the Northside pumping project, announced Friday that a test on a well has been finished and it is producing 7,000 gallons of water per minute. 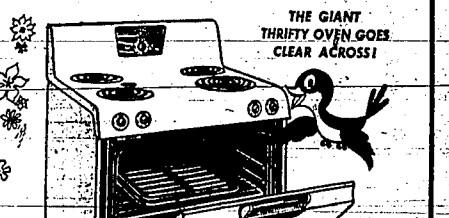

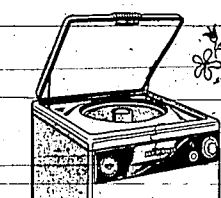

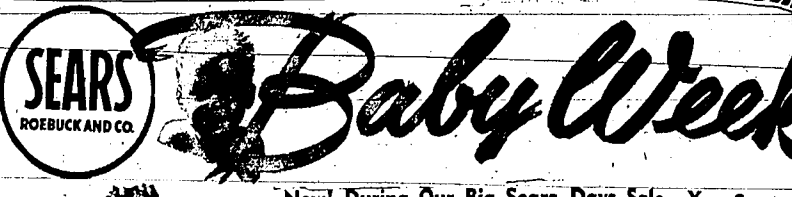

Agent Examines "Routine" Shipment

Strange Shipments Don't Impress T. E. Express Agent; He Handles Everything

"Three registered hogs, 12 hives of bees, a hunting dog and about 400 chickens arrived in Twin Falls by Railway Express Thursday morning, but the strange shipments didn't surprise to Agent George W. Turnes. Actually, Turnes can't think of a single item he hasn't handled during his 30 years in the express business. He would like to work for the old Wells-Pargo company Oct. 15, 1913, at Ocean Park, Calif. Those were the days when Al C. Harris and his circus were spending the winter at nearby Venice, so the express company found him becoming acquainted to all types of animals. Turnes played musical for elephants and, cry-writes he has been, he has had to look after steers on route to carnivals. But animals are not the only objects to travel by express. Turnes considers animal shipments routine, so he turns to other subjects when asked about out-of-the-ordinary shipments. "The most interesting shipment I ever handled was \$2,000,000 in gold," he says. He explains that in 1927, gold was being moved from Los Angeles to San Francisco. He was working in the Los Angeles office of Wells-Pargo at that time. During the same period of his career he handled large shipments of Mexican silver dollars. The cargo on their way to China, came from Mexico, through Los Angeles, and were sent on to China. The dollars came in boxes, 2,000 to each package. In 1918, the Wells-Pargo Express company joined with other express companies to form the American Express. Express company became the express agent in Rock Springs, and Turnes went to Pocatello as agent. He stayed there until 1926 and then went to Rock Springs. Was at the express agent. In 1929 the American Railway Express company became the Twin Falls Express agency and he stayed on as agent in Rock Springs until 1945 when he became agent in Twin Falls. In 1922, while he was at Rock Springs, he demonstrated the ability of express agents to get their shipments to the proper destination on short notice. Richard E. Byrd's moving pictures on his Antarctic expedition were scheduled to be shown at a Rock Springs theatre. On the night of the showing, the train bringing the film was delayed. A climber hit the area and formed a take about one-fourth mile across on the railroad tracks eight miles east of the city. Blocked by the lake were 22 westbound trains including the one with the film. Over a four-day period while the water drained away, the worried theater operator went to Turnes who took a notebook to the scene, viewed the lake, and returned with the film in time for the show. "The accomplishment of his office so far in 1950 that gave Turnes the most satisfaction was the successful handling of trucks and sheep shipped from Albany, Ore., to Twin Falls. About 100,000 eggs were handled in the shipments and not a single egg was broken. But accidents happen in the best-regulated business. In 1920, while Turnes was agent at Pocatello, an antelope escaped from its crate at the agency and created a minor riot as it led Turnes and his wife a chase through the city. A helpful stranger grabbed a bedspread from someone's yard to use as a net to catch the animal. The frate housewife called the police to rescue her property and confusion ensued. Finally, the antelope was straightened out, the tired antelope climbed a tree and Turnes caught it. Pocatello was also the scene of a clash between a parrot and a fox in the same shipment. The parrot got out of its cage, flew around the agency office and landed on the crate containing the tree. In the sudden entry of parrot court words the fox snapped off the bird's leg. The parrot hid to be destroyed and the company had to make the loss good. But the normal day in the life of an express agent is free from accidents. He just goes busily about his business of shipping household goods for experimental purposes, sending baby's to combat aphids, keeping a shipment of tropical fish alive, nursing rattlesnakes on their way to some carnival or breaking his back to pick up a three-ouzel container which turns out to be mercury weighing about 50 pounds. During World War express agents even handled parts of atomic bombs on their way to assembly points. But then, that didn't excite him.

The list was prepared by the principal and teachers and was endorsed by the Pre-School PTA. She said the parties were started because so many children have a fear of starting school. Mrs. Gillette said all eligible children, even though they have not received a personal invitation through the mail, are invited to attend.
