WASHINGTON, May 2 (AP)—Some 2,500 A.F.L. bakery workers put off for a week their nationwide strike against the Continental Baking Company.

The walkout, scheduled to start last night, was postponed six hours before the deadline at the request of the federal mediation service. The "core" of the dispute is the union's demand for company-wide bargaining. The mediation service will resume efforts to get both sides together next Friday morning.

Parleys Resumed In Chrysler Fight

DETROIT, May 2 (AP)—Mediators called sleep-starved Chrysler strike negotiators back into session today, striving for the key-to-"overdue" settlement of the costly walkout. Sheer exhaustion forced recess of marathon bargaining in its 52nd hour. A four-hour break was called at 4 a. m. (EST) when negotiators failed to make the progress mediators had hoped they would.

Chrysler officials said partial agreement had been reached to settle the 31-day strike. But the U. I. O.—United Auto Workers claimed "unresolved issues" held up return to work of the 69,000 strikers.

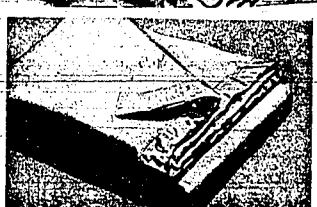

NEW YORK, May 2 (AP)—The fabulously successful Broadway hit "South Pacific" has won the 1950 Pulitzer prize for drama while the award for fiction went to A. B. Guthrie's bestselling historical novel, "The Way West."

These and other Pulitzer prizes in literature, letters and music were announced by President Dwight D. Eisenhower of Columbia University.

"South Pacific," a standing-room-only hit since it opened April 7, 1949, was written and produced by Richard Rodgers and Hammerstein and received a special Pulitzer award for "Oklahoma" in 1944.

Awards for distinguished and meritorious public service went to the Chicago Daily News and the St. Louis Post-Dispatch for a series of articles disclosing the practices of 61 Illinois newspapers on the state payroll.

The prize for distinguished local reporting was awarded to the larger of the New York Times for its account of the neighborhood slayings by Howard Tarnh, a career war veteran at Camden, N. J., in September, 1949.

Other journalistic awards included: National affairs—Kwinn O. Gushman of the Seattle, Wash., Times for stories that provided information clearing Prof. Mevin Rader, University of Washington, of communist charges.

International affairs—Edmond Stevens of the Christian Science Monitor for his series, "This is Russia—uncensored."

Editorial writing—Carl M. Beaumont, editor of the Jackson, Mich., Citizen-Patriot for an editorial resulting in official designation of May 1 as a day of prayer for peace.

Cartooning—James T. Berryman of the Washington Star for his cartoon, "All set for a super-secession in Washington." This cartoon depicted a map of the United States surrounded by microphones, television cameras and other instruments of mass communication.

News photograph—Bill Crouch, Oakland, Calif., Tribune, for his photo of a near-collision between a B-29 bomber and a stunt flier's plane.

Refugee Avers Reds' Rockets Target Alaska

NORRISTOWN, Pa., May 2 (AP)—A former Russian naval engineer said a slowway, says Russia has rocket installations pointed toward Alaska, Norway and Sweden, his attorney said.

The engineer, Victor Martumuk 35, was arrested as a stowaway at Philadelphia in April 8 by immigration and naturalization officials. A bill introduced by Sen. Edward Brooke, R-Mass., authorized the United States has passed the senate, his attorney said.

Clap said Martumuk reported that Russians have built rocket installations on the Arctic coast island of Novaya Zemlya. They are aimed at Alaska, he said. Installations north of Leningrad are aimed at the Baltic countries, Clap said.

He said Martumuk learned of the installations while he was a prison truck driver. He was arrested in 25 years imprisonment because he was an officer of an anti-communist army of Russian prisoners of war organized by the Germans.

Clap said the rockets are guard and field, aimed by a Russian underground.

Canadians Battle To Halt Further Spread of Flood

WINNIPEG, Man., May 2 (AP)—Volunteers sandbagged the levees of the swollen Red river today to protect Winnipeg from floods that already have inundated a score of towns and villages.

The river, fed by mountain runoff and intermittent snowmelt, was five and one-half feet above the flood level here, and was still rising. Each radio station appealed for all available citizens to help bolster levees in the suburban area.

Trains moved slowly over water-covered tracks to the main flood area between Winnipeg and the United States border.

An estimated 600 persons have fled their homes in Morris, Man., and engineers ventured that the flood crest still has not been reached there. The town was surrounded by flood waters measuring 14 miles across at its widest point.

WASHINGTON, May 2 (AP)—States in the Rocky mountain and Pacific northwest areas generally plan to spend more money for highway construction this year than in 1949.

The American Road Builders' association said today a survey shows Washington state is planning the same volume of expenditure this year as last. All other states in the area will increase their expenditures.

The nationwide trend is upward, the association said, with a record-shattering total of \$14,677,000 in road improvement planned.

"This upward trend," the association said, "reflecting desperation efforts of the road building traffic demands, still will leave us far short of the road building pace required to overcome the current highway crisis."
