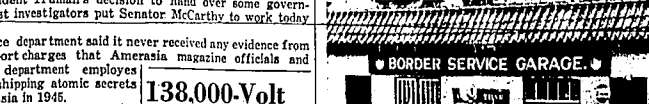

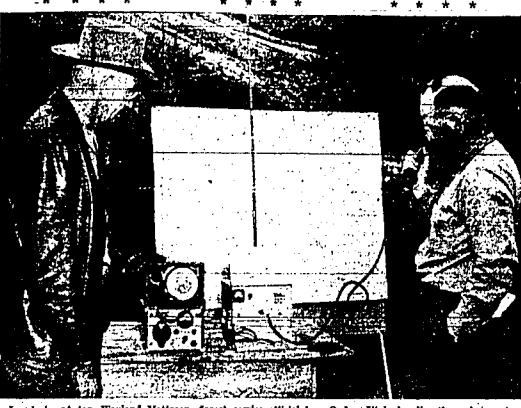

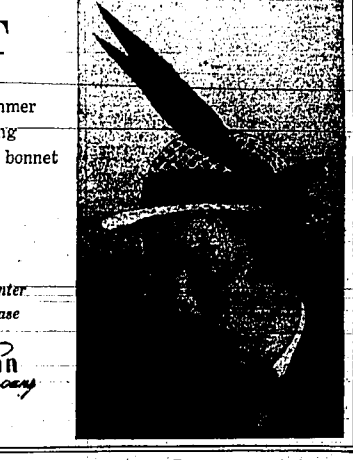

Farmers Told To Report on Abandonment

L. A. Winkie, acting chairman of the Twin Falls county production and marketing administration committee, Thursday issued a reminder to farmers who are abandoning damaged sugar beet crops that they must report this fact to the local PMA office.

Winkie said that the abandonment or crop deficiencies of harvested acreage may be considered for payments. Winkie said several points must be taken under consideration.

He said it must be determined whether the sugar beets were planted in the field for the production of sugar beets and whether the beets were cared for up to the time of abandonment or harvest as the case may be, in a manner which would have been expected under average conditions, to produce a normal crop of sugar beets.

Winkie said the owner must also describe whether the abandonment or crop deficiency resulted from drought, flood, storm, freeze, disease or insects and whether the acreage abandoned could have been returned to sugar beets under conditions offering at least a fair opportunity for production.

He said acreage seeded to sugar beets but abandoned under conditions which do not meet the above mentioned requirements and acreage harvested for livestock feed shall be excluded from the acreage reported as planted, abandoned or harvested. These acres will be disregarded in considering the conditions of payment.

Winkie warned growers the sugar act requires the deductions from payments under the sugar beet program if child labor is employed under certain conditions. The types of cases where deductions are applicable and the rates of deduction are as follows:

\$10 for each day or part of a day on which a child under 14 years of age has worked in the production, cultivation or harvesting of the crop and \$10 for each day or part of a day on which a child between 14 and 16 years of age has been required to work eight hours in any one day in production, cultivation or harvesting of the crop.

He said these deductions do not apply to labor performed by children of a producer who has an interest in the crop of 40 per cent or more. In applying for payment a producer is required to certify he has complied with child labor provisions and that proper deductions have been met.

Winkie said it is the producer's responsibility to obtain proof of the age of any child employed on the farm and crop. Age verification is issued pursuant to any child labor certificate carried out under state supervision. A transcript of a birth certificate, a baptismal certificate showing the date of birth; a passport or insurance policy or a Bible record may be used.

In applying for payment, sugar growers will be required to certify that the child labor certificate has been paid in full and at rates not less than those provided for in this district.

Drunken Driving Brings \$100 Fine

The 35-year-old youth involved in the accident also appeared before Judge Rudy, who recommended that he serve without bond. Lewis estimated damage to the car at \$150 and damage to the other car at \$100.

MARKETS AT A GLANCE
