Flooded Area Gets Respite; Waters Down

Floodwaters appeared receding today over parts of Nebraska and Oklahoma, where damage was estimated in the millions. The death toll in the two states was 25-30 ...

The Red river at Winnipeg was at its highest level in 100 years ...

Some 40,000 residents of the flooded areas southern Manitoba, the Winnipeg Tribune estimated, had taken refuge in the twin cities.

Floodwaters spilled out over one-eighth or more of the 19 square mile metropolitan area, and 540 square miles of southern Manitoba.

Flooding creeds and rivers in eastern and southern Oklahoma appeared to have reached their crests and receded slightly. Property damage was estimated at more than \$10,000,000. In addition to the two dead, two persons were missing.

A man and a woman were swept to their deaths in an automobile on a flooded bridge near Shawnee, Okla. Some 500 residents of Waterloo, Iowa, evacuated their homes, waters of two creeks isolated the community.
