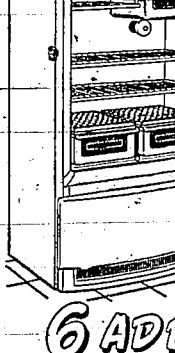

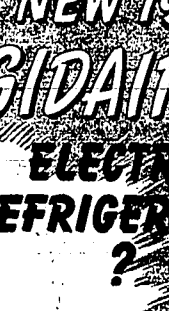

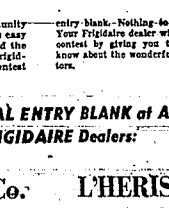

### Postmaster Asks Country Patrons To Fix up Boxes

Because substitute carriers will be used for all three Twin Falls rural mail routes by May 27, Postmaster W. W. Franke appealed Saturday to country patrons to make certain boxes are maintained properly.

He pointed out that boxes erected in the proper manner will receive the best of service. Boxes which are inscribed on the side will be invaluable to substitute carriers in continuing good mail service.

Franke said the postal department suggests that boxes be painted with either white or aluminum paint with names inscribed on the box in black letters not more than one inch high.

Other suggestions made by the department include: Boxes should be properly graded and graded—free of obstructions, with the box at car window height. All boxes erected on the right side of the road as traveled by the carrier, and facing the road.

Boxes should be waterproof. Posts should be planted firmly and painted white, with the box attached in a level position.

Postmaster Franke emphasized that names should be painted on all boxes. He pointed out that substitute carriers will not be too familiar with the routes and will have no way of knowing who owns a box on which there is no name or unrecodable printing.

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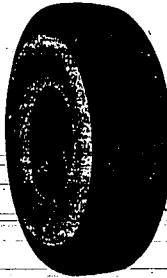
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
