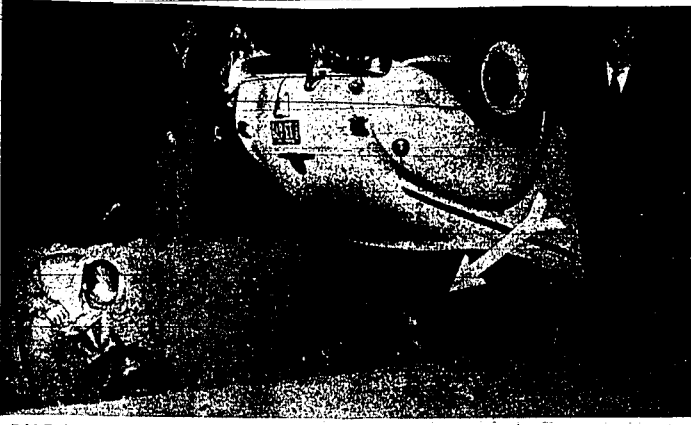

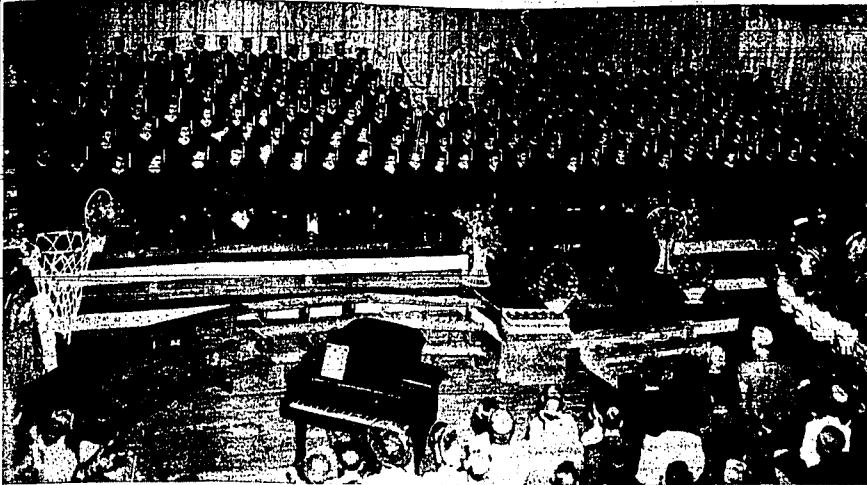



Russian Ships Appear Near English Land

LONDON, May 19 (AP)—Two more Russian ships appeared off the British coast today, bringing to nine the number sighted within 24 hours.

The two travelers passed through the straits of Dover early in the afternoon, headed for the open Atlantic.

The Russian ships appeared 400 miles off the British home fleet base at Portland last night. Naval observers wondered whether it was design or accident that brought the Russians there on the eve of western union naval maneuvers.

In English Channel
The vessels, two fishing boats and five tugs, showed up in the English channel near the Isle of Wight shortly before dusk.

The Russians reported they were en route from the Baltic to the Black sea and asked permission to shelter in Christ Church bay, claiming 20 ships in the convoy had broken down.

An officer from a naval motor torpedo boat boarded one of the vessels. He was "courteously received" and informed no help was needed. Later the convoy steamed off in a westerly direction in perfect formation.

First Since War
Admiralty sources believed it was the first instance of Russian fishing vessels passing down the channel from the Baltic to the Black sea since World War I.

Naval observers were impressed with the perfect formation kept by the vessels.

This is not ordinary group of fishing vessels, one watcher said. They are well found ships in distinct shape. No fishing vessels ever kept precise formation like this. They looked like minemen.

The crews have big, powerful binoculars.
