City Accepts Barbecue Pit Donation; Park, Recreation Week to Be Marked

Abraham Amos, 645 Second avenue south, won high praise from city officials Saturday afternoon when they formally accepted a barbecue pit he donated to the city through the Twin Falls Kiwanis club. Amos, a local brick mason, built the pit at South park, donating all the material and labor which are valued at \$450.

The acceptance of the latest addition to the city park system preceded the announcement by City Manager William R. Smith that this week will be observed as national park and recreation week. The purpose of the observance is to present to the public in a composite picture the beauties, services and facilities of all parks throughout the country and particularly the municipal park system in Twin Falls.

Amos said the idea for a barbecue pit at South park started when the Kiwanis club held a picnic there last summer. The club decided to make it a project and Amos volunteered to furnish the labor and materials.

He poured the 8 by 10-foot concrete base on which it sets last fall and began work on the pit and the wall surrounding the base in March. However, in spite of Amos' generous contribution to the park, vandals reportedly have hampered the work by knocking bricks from the low wall which is used for a seat. Harmon Park's Softball Field Flooded As 54-Inch Pipe Fails to Carry "Load"

The "second annual" flood of the softball field at Harmon park began Friday as the 54-inch pipe for the eighth-avenue-lateral between Elizabeth and Locust streets failed to carry its allotted head of water.
The pipe was installed about one year ago and the flood conditions at the park have existed since whenever large amounts of water are sent through the park.
City Manager W. R. Smith said Saturday a meeting had been scheduled "tentatively" for Monday afternoon between city officials and representatives of the Twin Falls Canal company.
"There are several possibilities for correction of the situation," he said, "and we hope to make a decision on what to do at that time."
The city manager explained that the flood condition has baffled city and private industry engineers. "By all hydraulic engineering principles, the pipe should carry the full head of water, but for some unknown reason it doesn't," he said. "Something has to be done and will be done so that water users can get their full supply for the heavy irrigation season," he added.
The water was shut off Friday and city workmen crawled the length of the pipe to determine that there was no obstruction between the Elizabeth boulevard, beginning and the end of the pipe at Locust street and Eighth avenue east.
The water had backed up in the canal so that it overflowed the bank and spread over the softball diamond and along the boulevard.
J. A. McEwen, Twin Falls Canal company engineer, said Saturday he thinks the trouble lies in the shape of the pipe. The pipe, although equal in circumference to a 54-inch diameter round pipe, has been made in a squashed design so that it is only 48 inches deep.
"This changes the end area and the center of gravity of the flow of water," he explained, "thereby changing the hydraulic properties of the pipe." He added that little has been determined of the hydraulic properties of the "squashed" pipe, a new design in culverts and conduits.

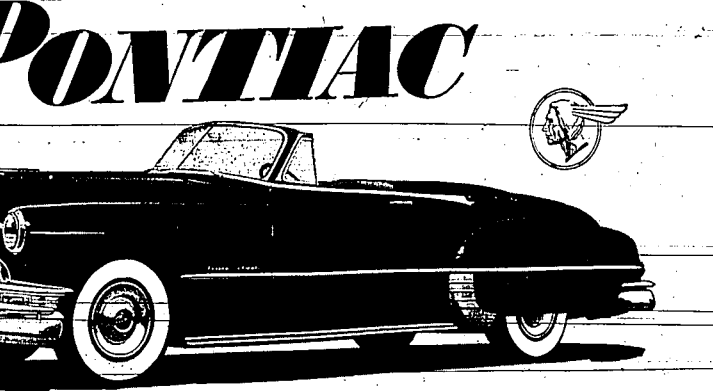

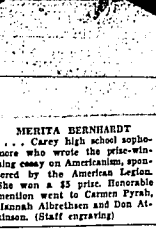
