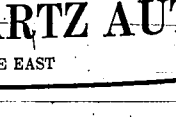

At long last the United States is to have a national science foundation aimed at keeping this country pre-eminent in scientific research. From the standpoint of scientific progress, it is a relief to be able to have one of our important bills passed by congress since the war.

In one form or another the measure had been kicking around capitol hills since 1945. President Truman vetoed a science foundation proposal in 1948 because he didn't like the administrative setup it called for.

The present measure provides that the foundation shall be governed by a 24-member national science board appointed by the president. With the consent of the senate he also chooses the foundation director who would serve as administrative head.

WORRIED—Murray's concern is not due solely to recent election tests, and has been growing since the 1948 election.

SYMBOLIC—The more sensible and tolerant attitude recently shown by management also operates to weaken this new effort to organize all other states in a broad coalition to pool their interests in a "co-operative" industrial and business leaders seem to have learned a few hard lessons during the years in the Roosevelt-Truman doxhouse.

VIEWERS OF OTHERS

Meanwhile progress will continue to be made in the development of production and distributive methods, in the development of labor saving devices, etc., the familiar American pattern, with the political tradition of the credit while the rest of us do the work.
