**Memories of Colorful Troupe Reviewed by Hagerman Folks**

HAGERMAN, May 23—With the recent death of Robert F. Redmon, 82, memories of one of the old world colorful show troupes persisted in review in the minds of Hagerman oldtimers. The Redmon family came from Kentucky into California. Then about 1888, when Robert was 20 years old, he drifted into Idaho, where he took a farm job with Madison Durfee, grandfather of the Durfee and Mrs. Emma Jenkins. A year later he married the boss' daughter, Addie Durfee. After several years the couple moved into the Hagerman vicinity. Madison Durfee returned from work one evening, he found her mother had died. Mrs. Jenkins heard from Lou years later that she had married and was traveling with her husband, but never ever heard from her again. The whereabouts of fate of Fred likewise is unknown. He developed "cold fever" and died many years down by Snake river several miles from town where he engaged in mining. People here have always been puzzled as to what became of him as he disappeared suddenly from this community and was never heard of again.

Robert served as deputy sheriff of Twin Falls county for some time and was also on the police force there. After his wife died he returned to grow-up feeling of chewing tobacco. Robert himself was never a part of the famous Redmon show troupe consisting of the mother, sister Lou, and two brothers, Hile and Fred, although he was musically inclined. They visited him here in Hagerman on several occasions. Those who heard their performance say they formed a versatile troupe with a large repertoire of songs, dances, acrobatics and instrumental music. Mrs. Jenkins said on one occasion when she had a house full of company and "Aunt Lou" volunteered to entertain for her. She was a natural born show-woman and as she pleased among those present playing the violin and piano with artful ease. She flung the lid of the fiddle. Mrs. Jenkins was holding in her hand with the violin bow without missing a note. After Mr. and Mrs. Redmon moved to Twin Falls, his mother and Lou came there to live. Lou played the piano in one of the theaters. Upon returning from work one evening, he found her mother had died. Mrs. Jenkins heard from Lou years later that she had married and was traveling with her husband, but never ever heard from her again. The whereabouts of fate of Fred likewise is unknown. He developed "cold fever" and died many years down by Snake river several miles from town where he engaged in mining. People here have always been puzzled as to what became of him as he disappeared suddenly from this community and was never heard of again.

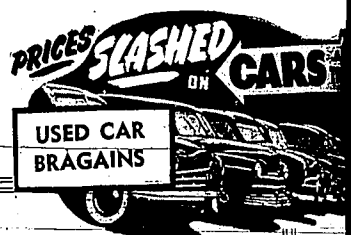
