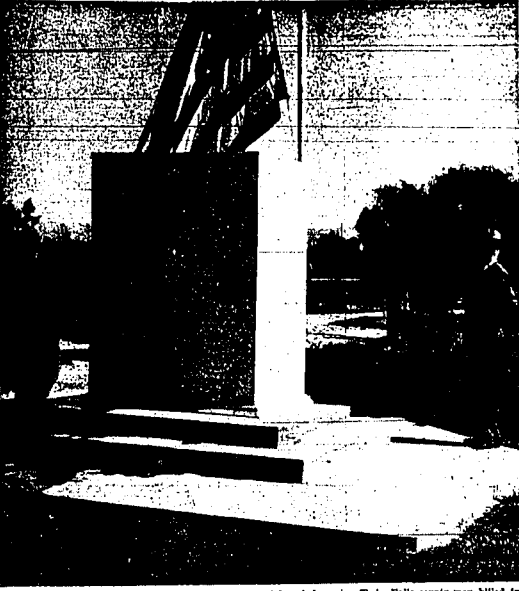

Rupert Man Receives Alligators From Florida as Payment for Pole Cat Net

RUPERT, May 27.—Louis Dupain is a fine man to know if his alligators you want—or orchid plants from Hawaii, or Alaskan salmon, or palm leaves from Jamaica, or maybe even a bottle of champagne from France, said Dupain.

And he's just as fine a person not to know if you're a somewhat staid amateur radio operator, contradictorily wanting to join the Pole Cat Net. This price of membership is measured in an ordinary currency.

In fact, just take them—Dupain will give them to you with his compliments upon your avowal that you know how to raise them this far from their native Florida.

There's just better you can hold them both in one hand if you have a large hand—but they were big enough to get Merwin L. Rawley, Green Cove Springs, Fla., into the Pole Cat Net. And it was by agreement that they were agreed to Rupert Thursday morning in a cross between a box and a cage.

Joining Rupert citizens in congratulating Dupain on the arrival of the babies was Charles Whitaker, secretary-manager of the Chamber of Commerce. No rose-colored glasses were needed for him to say this will increase the Rupert population by two.

Like earlier settlers on the Minidoka project, the alligators' first interest was in getting a homestead. They have it—in the Dupain bathtub. But that's not why Dupain wants to send his alligators away. After all, he has a highly cranked document which states: "Louis Dupain, WIWY, has been elected in skunk, sinker and chicken thief of the Pole Cat Net, and as such he is entitled to louse up, mess up and destroy any and all decent (conventional) on the air by his notorious odor or signal. Members are prohibited from bathing in order to disguise themselves from other amateurs."

That's why alligators homesteaded in his bathtub doesn't perturb Dupain. It's just that he's no expert on the care and feeding of young alligators. He had the same trouble with the orchid plants from Hawaii and gave them to a friend who has the green thumb.

Dupain is no ordinary skunk in the Pole Cat Net—he's an officer of the mildly resistant title of Chief Social Outcast. And it was in that capacity he jokingly asked Rawley to send him some alligators. Rawley, who operates amateur radio station WQAS, wanted to join the Pole Cat Net.

It seems that to become a member you have to contact three skunks by short-wave radio. After sending these three messages into the Magic Valley Radio club, it seems you have to send something else—alligators, orchid plants or such.

Dupain thusly has acquired letters

Now, non-member amateurs hold definite views about it. Dupain proudly points out what the secretary-manager of the Chamber of Commerce may have overlooked—Rupert has 17 amateur radio operators, more than any other town its size. What's more, it has more mobile transmitters for the

number of amateur radio operators than anywhere else.

200 Youngsters Take Driver Tests in County; Sheriff Reports No Failures

About 200 teen-agers have taken driver tests in the office of Twin Falls County Sheriff James E. Carlton since he started the first driver's examinations in Idaho last January. None has failed.

Continuing his campaign to reduce the accident toll in Magic Valley, Sheriff Carlton says "I wish every person who has an idea on how to make our enforcement-of-safe-driving-laws-or-how-to-cut-down-on-traffic-driving would call me or write a letter."

Carlton added he is having paid printed under the aegis of the Twin Falls Safety council for reports on reckless driving. The pads will be issued to responsible persons and carried in cars. When an offense is witnessed, the person will be down the time, place, offense and license number of the reckless driver and turn the sheet over to the sheriff.

Sheriff Carlton thinks notices sent to drivers will warn them they are being watched. In the case of teen-agers using the family car, parents will know their children are guilty of reckless driving.

The driving tests are given to all persons who have not had a license previously. Carlton and his officers give the tests on their own time. Sheriff Carlton pointed out there has been no state allotment for such tests and no money has been provided by the county. If the applicant does not have a car for the driving test the examination is given in the car of the private car belonging to Sheriff Carlton or his deputies.

"We are willing to spend our own time and money in carrying out our safe driving campaign," Sheriff Carlton said.

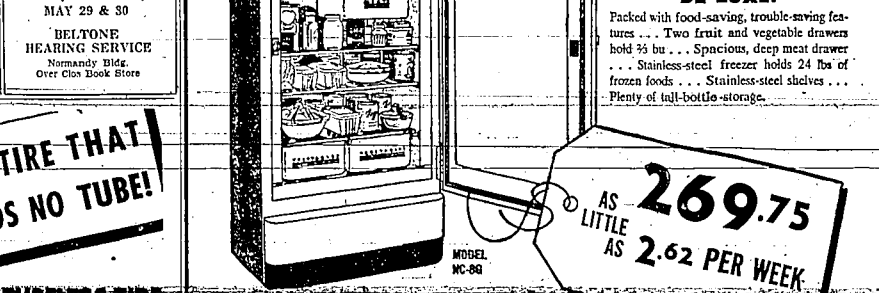
