### More Protein Foods Boost Turkey Meat

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Moscow, June 3—Every pound of turkey that is well chosen provides more protein and more efficient nutrition, according to a statement made this week by C. F. Peterson, associate nutritionist at the University of Idaho.

Increasing the amount of protein materials such as fish meal, soybean oil meal or meat meal, provides more essential nutrients and speeds up the turkey's growth.

**Lower Fiber Content**  
Decrease the fiber content by greatly reducing the amount of oats, mill feeds, and alfalfa. Birds don't do so well on coarse feeds, especially during the first few weeks of life. Instead, use a lot of low fiber corn for increasing energy and making better use of the higher protein.

An experiment conducted at the university resulted in 40 cents more income over feed costs on each bird fed a high-energy ration of this type. At the end of eight weeks, turkeys fed the high-protein high-energy ration gained almost one-half pound more than those fed a higher fiber content ration.

**Average Difference**  
The experiment further revealed that after 25 weeks, the average difference increased to almost one and one-half pounds for turkey toms. There was little difference in weight of turkey hens on the ration.

Peterson's records show that it required no extra feed to produce the extra weight. Feed costs per pound of gain were slightly less for the high-energy ration than for gains made with high fiber feeds.
