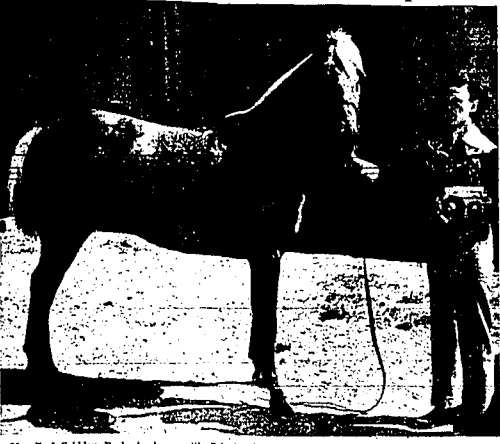

Moon Low in South During June's Nights

By J. HUGH FREUETT
Astronomer, Extension Division, Oregon Higher Education System

Did you notice the past week how low in the south the big moon glided across the sky? This indicated that the longest days are at hand, for then the full moon goes along in the same approximate arc as during the summer days.

Did you ever get up for sunrise? Surely you are for sunset. Notice how far toward the north are the rising and setting points.

Another herald of summer is the appearance low in the southern of the bright red star Antares, the heart of the celestial scorpion. In fading twilight the energetic morning star Venus flashes splendidly. Further east in the eastern sky is the brilliant Mars, return appear.

To the right of Spica we encounter two planets. The first one, decolorately reddish, is the oft-discussed Mars. Still farther west, in line with Spica and Mars, comes the ringed Saturn. And to the right, the blue white star Regulus stands at the end of the sickle handle. The telescopic world Neptune is also in the northern horizon.

Some distance above the horizon and toward the north of west are (from left to right) the bright stars Pollux and Castor, the heavenly twins, standing side by side. Far over in the northwest, brilliant, glittering Capella swings toward the northern horizon.

Idaho Workers' Compensation Handled Well, Speaker Opines

"Workmen's compensation in Idaho is being handled as well under the present state law as it could be under any alternative law we have considered," State Sen. Carl Irwin, R., Twin Falls, told Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce members Friday.

Speaking at the weekly luncheon meeting at the Park hotel, the member of the senate legislative committee for a study of workmen's compensation, added that the present law may be suggested through hearings now being conducted by the committee. Several controversial issues have arisen in the hearings, he explained.

He pointed out that the law appears to liberal in its protection of workers and said courts have interpreted law in favor of an employer in only two of the many court cases to which the law has been subjected.

Old T. F. Building Being Demolished

One of the oldest buildings in Twin Falls is being demolished at 100 Sherman street today to make way for a new warehouse and office.

The Magic City Fuel company warehouse, erected in 1912 and occupied by the same company for 20 years, is being dismantled and a 70 by 100 foot structure will take its place.

C. W. Nye, company manager, said lumberblocks and fixtures from the old building will be used in the new structure. When finished it will be used for storage and office space. A foundation for the new building will be poured next week. The old warehouses will be demolished but the office will remain until the final structure is ready. Nye said work probably will be finished in 90 days.

The fuel company, which also distributes beer, will use the warehouse to store beer cases and will rent out part of it for custom storage. Estimated cost of the project is \$10,000.

State Stocks Of Peas and Beans Down

BOISE, June 3—Idaho stocks of dry peas and beans were down considerably on May 1 as compared with Jan. 1, the U. S. department of agriculture reported today. The May 1 holdings of 1,241,000 bags of beans was 27 per cent smaller than that of Jan. 1 and dry pea stocks were off 41 per cent. There were 870,000 bags of dry peas in the state May 1. Bean holdings included 2,000 bags of small whites, 977,000 bags of great northern, 303,000 bags of pinto, 100,000 bags of small reds and 129,000 bags of other varieties. Dry pea stocks included 235,000 bags of Alaska and other smooth green kinds, 48,000 bags of first and best and other white and white seeded varieties and 27,000 bags of other types, mainly wrinkled varieties grown for seed. There were about 4,800 pea plants in the U. S. in 1949, only four in 1950.

Sprinkler Water System Installed

OAKLEY, June 3—Thirty acres of formerly idle land above a canal have been brought into production by L. J. Robinson, jr. through the installation of a sprinkler irrigation system on his farm northeast of here.

The water goes from the ditch into a sump from which it is pumped over the canal into a four-inch aluminum pipeline 4,400 feet long. The line has T-valves 60 feet apart to which lateral lines are attached.

Every 40 feet on the lateral line is a also about two feet high stop which is a sprinker head. The lower vent revolves and covers close to the line and the upper vent throws the water in a circle more than 40 feet in radius.
