TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—The administration's anti-trust program, which is the backbone of the General Electric company, judging from the evidence of congressional hearings, seems to have aroused a public reaction which is not necessarily in favor of the department of justice to dissolve the Atlantic and Pacific power pools. It is not surprising that the relatively low rates for lighting, heating, and power have attracted a very favorable public reaction. What even the critics on and off capital markets have not realized is that this reflects the anti-business attitude of the Truman-McGrath group. They admit that the Aluminum company of America, the du Ponts, General Motors, and other great enterprises are other anti-trust indictments.

FINDING—A proposed finding submitted to a federal district court in Trenton, N. J., based on almost 10 years of litigation, the government asks that General Electric be forced to divest itself of half of its bulb-and-lamp holdings, including public utility holdings. The government claims that this reflects the anti-business attitude of the Truman-McGrath group. They admit that the Aluminum company of America, the du Ponts, General Motors, and other great enterprises are other anti-trust indictments.

INTEREST—The OE case demands unusual public-law interest because of the strange fact that the government is engaged in unfair or anti-consumer practices at any time or place. The government claims that this reflects the anti-business attitude of the Truman-McGrath group. They admit that the Aluminum company of America, the du Ponts, General Motors, and other great enterprises are other anti-trust indictments.

POWER—But although General Electric has never used its power for malign purposes, or shown any intention of so using its commanding position in this field. Attorney General Cummings, in a recent statement, expressed his interest in the marketing and licensing agreements and control of certain parts of supply. 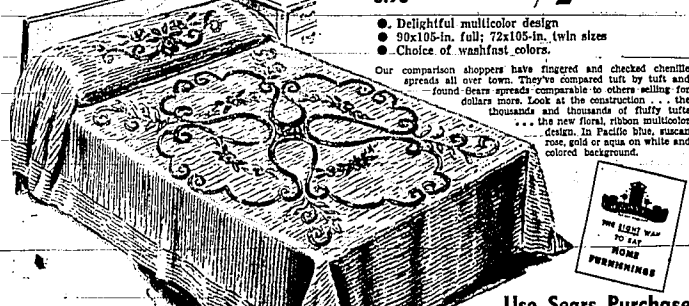

BOSTON, May 7.—Last week's evidence of the power of pure Christian Science to solve modern problems in modern times were reported here by the Christian Science board of directors.

The state contest was held at Boise last year with a large entry list and large crowds attending. Cochran said he expects a turnout at Twin Falls as good as last year's or better.

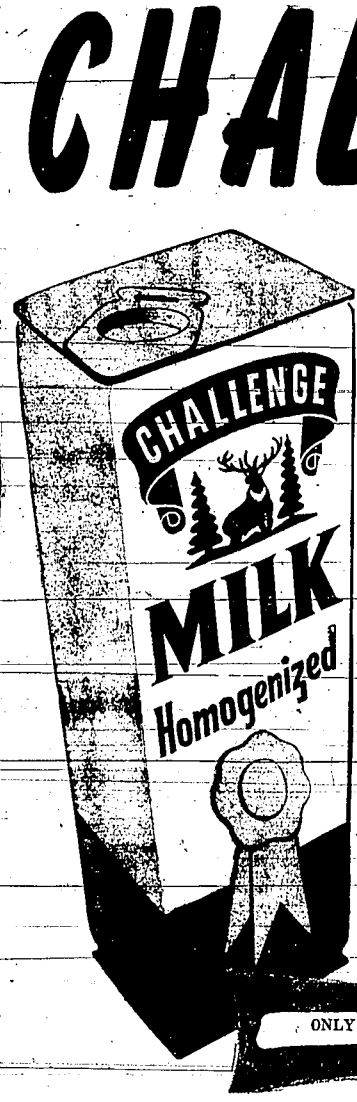

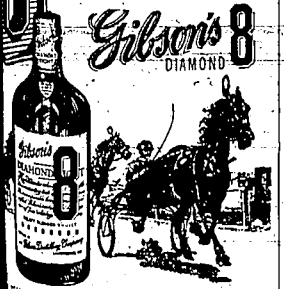

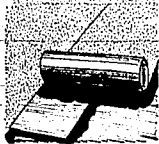
