Deadline for Disabled Vet Tax Cut Near

Disabled veterans who are eligible for 1945 tax exemptions must file their exemption claims by June 15, according to the U. S. Treasury Department.

To be eligible for the tax exemption, the veteran must have been in the service of the United States during the period of the war, and must have been discharged with a disability of 30 percent or more.

Other provisions for eligibility are that the veteran must have owned his property on or before the second Monday in January, 1945; his net income for 1945 must not exceed \$3,000 a year, and his total assets must not exceed \$10,000.

The amount of the allowed tax exemption is \$1,000 of the assessed value of the property.

Disabled veterans who have made previous claims for the tax exemption must make their claim for the current year at any time between the second Monday of January and the second Monday of July, 1945, unless they are making their first claim, which must be made by June 15 and July 10 of this year.

Russ-Set Line Gains Okay of Reich, Poland

BERLIN, June 8 (AP)—Communist-ruled east Germany in a joint declaration with Poland has ratified the loss of nearly 30,000 square miles of eastern territory.

A communique issued here and in Warsaw said the two governments had agreed on the "permanent marking" of their new frontier on the Oder-Neisse river line.

Anti-communist newspapers in Berlin-minority newspapers in the German government of traitorously "selling the eastern territories."

The reaction was angriest in western Germany's overcrowded communities where 8,000,000 Germans, expelled from the lost territories, have resided.

The announcement was a bitter pill, too, for the 18,000,000 Germans in the Russian zone, coming as it did a month after the disclosure that no more war prisoners will be returned by Russia and that reparations must be paid to Moscow for another 15 years.

All west German political parties demand eventual return of the territories east of the Oder-Neisse. And American officials regard it as the most popular issue in Germany.

U. S. High Commissioner John J. McCloy and a British foreign office spokesman said the agreement would not be required by the western powers. Informed British sources in London speculated that a "sift" protocol would be sent to Poland and Russia.

2 Sentenced for Parole Violation

BOISE, June 8 (AP)—Two Weiser brothers have been sentenced to penitentiary terms after pleading guilty to charges of violating their paroles.

U. S. District Judge Chase A. Clark sentenced Donald Clark Smith to six months and Albert Frank Smith to five months.

Lloyd Clumm, "renegade," was given a two-year suspension after he pleaded guilty to a charge of interstate transportation of stolen property.

Luther J. Fribble, Illinois, was given preliminary indictment and commutation of transportation—a charge of interstate transportation of stolen property. He will be sentenced later.

WASHINGTON, June 8 (AP)—The world moves on, but fast. That was well illustrated today by a government printing office announcement.

The printing office, which can tell you how to care for a baby, incubate a goose egg or pot an orchid, says it's coming out with a new book.

Normally the printing office doesn't bother itself into a tizzy over book titles. But this time is different. It thinks it has a "hot" hot best seller on its hands.

The book's title: "The Effects of Atomic Weapons."

Prepared by the atomic energy commission, the book was written by more than 100 scientists and military men.

Obviously hitherto unpublished details of atomic explosions, says the printing office, "it is the first completely authoritative document on the over-all effects of atomic weapons."

The book won't be off the presses until around Aug. 1, but the printing office is so sure that it has a best-seller that it's taking advance orders.

If you, too, hanker to know what an A-bomb will do, you can reserve your copy by sending \$1.25 (cash, check or money order) to the U. S.

government printing office, division of public documents, Washington 25, D. C.

The superintendent of documents, Roy B. Eastin, Jr., got a pretty fair idea of the pulling power of the atom bomb by what happened to the so-called Gimphe report.

This report on the A-bomb came out shortly after the first bomb was dropped. And although it's full of difficult equations, the printing office has sold 27,984 copies.

But not even the atom bomb has blasted the babies out of first place in the government's printing affection.

Look at "Children's bureau publication No. 8, Infant care." It's a 15-cent item, and although it has passed 6,000,000, it still is going strong.



Soaring Meat Price Climbs Near Record

By United Press

Meat prices are rising swiftly, led by a skyrocketing boost in the price of beef, a United Press survey in 16 cities showed today.

The higher prices in meat—near record levels in some cities—are part of a general pattern in which housewives are paying more for almost all types of food.

The Dun and Bradstreet market analysis and statistics division reported at its highest level since Jan. 19, 1940. The index rose six cents during the past week to a level of 16. A year ago it stood at \$5.73 and it was \$6.02 on Jan. 10, 1940.

Beefers' Meat

Four, oats, hams, lard, cheese, coffee, cocoa, eggs, potatoes, raisins and nuts were later selling for higher prices. But beef and hogs were among foods listed as declining somewhat during the past week.

The agriculture department warned, meanwhile, that prices of most meats would decline again throughout the summer although a few types may decline for a time.

The department added, however, that further advances are likely later.

Demand Gain Seen

"The long-run outlook is for demand to increase substantially," the report said.

The United Press survey showed an annual price of meat had increased substantially since a year ago, with the biggest rise shown in the last month. Beef, particularly the better cuts, increased the most. Lamb and pork rose only slightly and declined in some cities.

Marriage Set In Florida by Full Amputee

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., June 8 (AP)—Jimmy Wilson, whose courage made up for his loss of both arms in World War II, will be married to Dorothy Mungen, a veterinarian model, his sweetheart of seven years, who both attended Jacksonville Junior college here. He is 35 and she is 27.

One of two quadruple amputees from World War II, Wilson lost all his limbs in the greatest war-time plane crash.

Wilson, a member of a nine-man crew to survive a crash in the Vermont mountains in 1944, was hospitalized in deep snow for three days before help could arrive and resulting severe frost-bite scars.

Graduated by School of Business Administration and entered the University of Florida. His student pro-law and was graduated last Monday from the law school at Boulder, Colo., where he will continue his law studies at the University of Colorado.

Two newspapers, the Philadelphia Eagle and the Jacksonville Journal, told the public of Jimmy's plight after the Vermont crash. The people responded by buying him \$120,000 worth of war bonds.

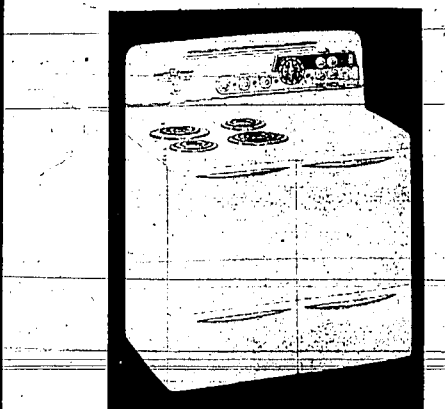

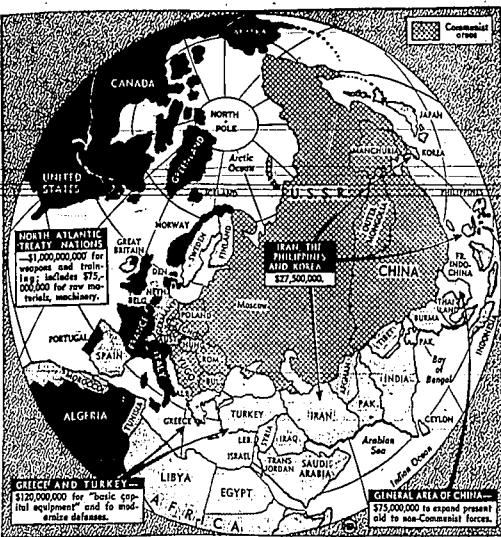

"Completely Bewildered" "Frankly, we are completely bewildered by some of the recent developments," one senator said. "Either someone is over-exaggerating his imagination or there has been some loose talking. "Either way, we would like to know the score."

The legislator said he has not raised the question formally at a committee session, but he said it is disturbing to all of his colleagues and may be brought into the open soon. "I want Specific News Members of the joint committee would not discuss the specific reports which have disturbed them. But one said they include numerous stories—dated by definite officials—that this country has produced: 1. "Baby" atomic bombs that could be carried by fighter planes. 2. Artillery shells and guided missiles with atomic warheads. "This committee member said these were only two of the disturbing reports that there are others which he would not specify."

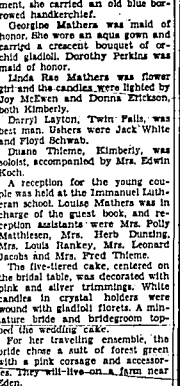

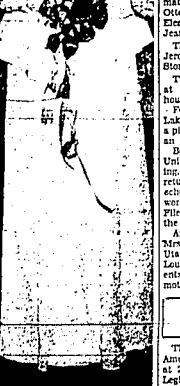

Wood River Areas Open to Trout Fishing Next Week

Hundreds of Idaho and Utah-fishermen are expected to attend the opening next Thursday of Henry's lake, and portions of Big Wood and Little Wood rivers, the state fish and game department reports. Henry's lake and all tributaries except Stanley springs and Hatcher creek will be open from June 15 to Oct. 31. However creek below the county road between Henry's and Stanley springs will be open from June 15 to Oct. 31. The Eastern brook spawner are vulnerable; after that date, department biologists reported. Henry's lake is recognized as one of the finest cutthroat and rainbow trout waters of the state.

Reports indicate that an excellent supply of fighting trout will be on hand for anglers. Game department employees stationed at the spawning stations said a large run of trout were being spawned this spring. Fishermen were reminded that 500 trout averaging 20 inches in length have been placed in Henry's lake by the game department. Purpose of the tagging is to determine whether the spawning fish are the same as the fish in the lake. Resort owners in the area are providing traps for tags returned to the game department. Tags were not lagged, as tag laws were not large enough to be locked in bottles.

Big Wood river and tributaries above the old spinning sheep bridge, between approximately four miles below Stanley's Crossing, and Little Wood river and all tributaries above near Idaville, will be open June 15 to Oct. 31. Department Biologist Forrest Haddock said that 200 trout have been placed in Big Wood river to date. Six hundred more tagged fish will be placed this summer. Haddock said that tags is important as information is being gathered regarding the migration of hatchery reared fish.

Idaho game department pilot, Joe Monaghan, reports that well over 5000 trout have been placed in hatcheries over the state during the last few weeks. Eggs are flown from Henry's lake and Ashton hatcheries in refrigerated boxes to landing points near other stations. Aerial transit saves several days en route and eggs arrive in good condition. Haddock said that the fish will be placed in the water within the month. Approximately 10,000,000 eggs will be moved in this manner.

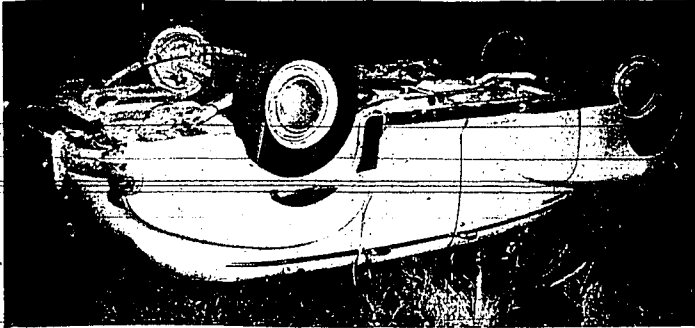

One of Northwest's Finest Arrowhead Collections Owned by Gooding Couple

GOODING, June 8.—Possibly of more of the people of the world observed the time-honored practice of cutting the peace pipe of the early American Indian and less than a dozen years ago the Gooding couple, who live on the town and the town, were able to collect a fine collection of arrowheads and spear points.

Johnson believes they have one of the finest collections of arrowheads in the Northwest. The interesting part is that most of them have been collected within a radius of some 50 miles of Gooding.

Johnson frequently is interrupted from his work by interested persons who really always recalled "something just like that piece" which was a "rock happy" kid with a bag full of rocks and the question, "What kind is this one, mister?" And Johnson is only too glad to add down with the youngster or group of boys and help identify each rock.

One lad was intrigued with a rock which he was sure contained gold. Johnson patiently told him it was only "fool's gold," and that many a day of chasing and other silly persons worked themselves to death trying to pan the gold.

To give just a faint idea of how many arrowheads the peace pipe Johnson has on display an authentic pipe used by Billit Bull, loaned to the collection by Mrs. John H. Johnson, father of Mrs. Mary L. Johnson, Twin Falls, former president of the Idaho State Historical Society, is shown in the display case.

The peace pipe was given to his father, John H. Johnson, by Billit Bull, a well-known hunter and trapper, who gave the pipe to him in the fall of 1927, signed by Mary L. Johnson and noted "Learned to Don and Arrowhead, June, 1927."

To give just a faint idea of how many arrowheads the Johnsons have in their collection Mrs. Johnson recently completed a matched pair of tiny arrowheads for earrings and a necklace, perfect match, 5-6-0. And some perfect pair.

They have some priceless, exquisite pieces that only expert cutting and polishing will reveal. But it is not all fun. There is plenty of hard work entailed and considerable expense—but an immense satisfaction when the polished piece is set on the display shelf.
