### Citizen's Unusual Life Ends; Buried in Family Mausoleum

HAGERMAN, June 9—A page of history has been turned with the death of Frank C. Mariner, pioneer resident of Hagerman since 1909. He died June 3 at the age of 65.

"The Mariner are of French Huguenot descent," said Mrs. Leta M. Evans, his daughter. "They migrated to the United States in the early days of our country, first settling in Massachusetts. Since then each generation has made a more west."

Mariner received his early education in Illinois, where he also attended Lombard university, studying law until his health forced him to leave school. He continued to read law and was admitted to the bar. In 1922 he migrated to South Dakota where he acquired a homestead and taught school.

He was one of the founders of Northville, S. D., where he made his home for 25 years. While at Northville he was active in legal and political circles, served as president of the Farmers State bank and helped establish the first rural telephone system in the county.

According to the records Mariner earned an enviable reputation in real circles for having settled more cases out of court than any other attorney in the county.

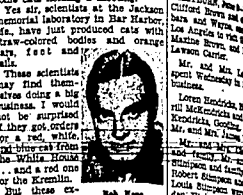

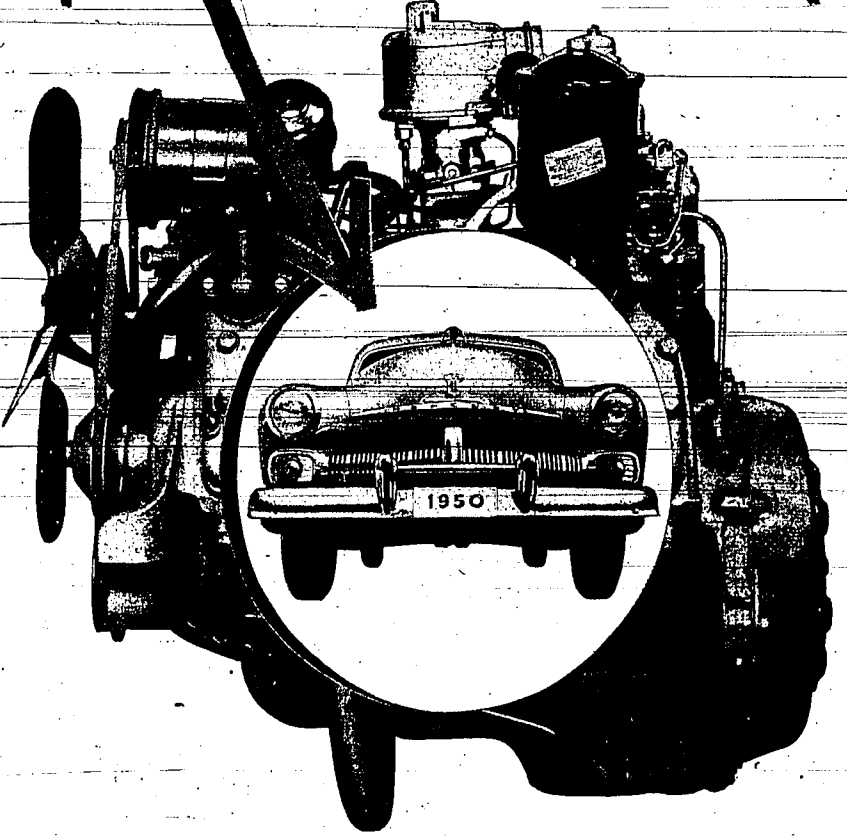

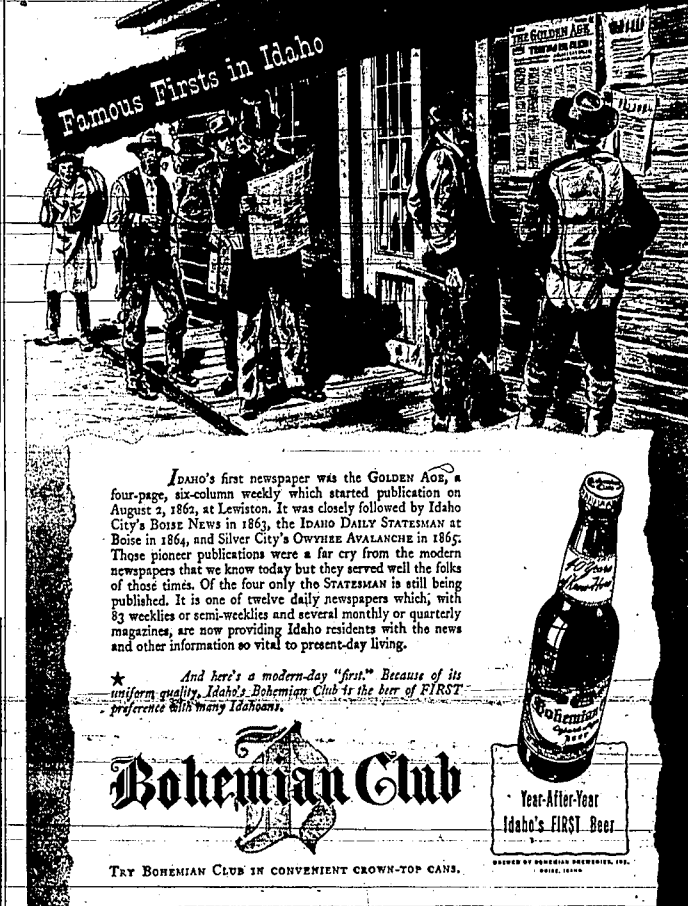

### Senate Backs State Schools In Fund Fight

WASHINGTON, June 9 (AP)—Congress has backed up the land grant colleges and universities in their \$3,000,000 dispute with the veterans administration.

The senate approved a house-passed bill which prohibits the VA from treating those schools any differently from other universities when making federal payments for veterans education. The measure now goes to the White House.

The land grant schools receive annual payments from trust funds created from the sale of public lands. The VA, under what the senate labor committee called "a strained interpretation" of law, has made deductions for these federal payments when paying the schools for teaching veterans under the GI bill of rights.

The committee said it was never the intent of congress that such reductions should be made.

The bill, if signed by the President, will wipe out VA claims against some of the land grant schools and also require the VA to reimburse schools for any deductions that have been made about \$3,000,000 is involved.

A committee aide said, as an example, this bill would mean about \$15,000 a year for Montana State college.
