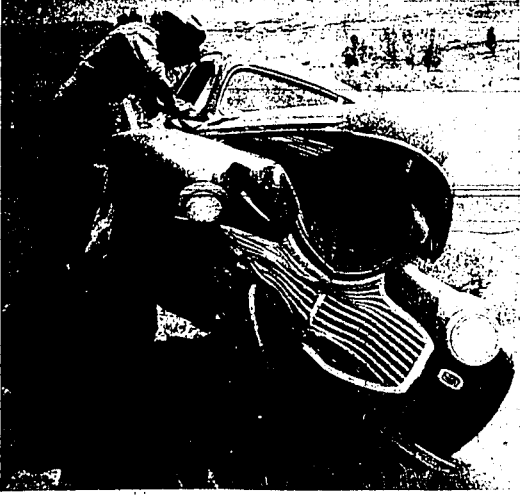

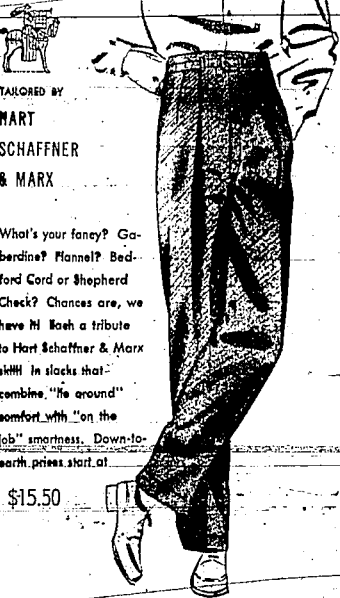
Memorial Events Scheduled Today

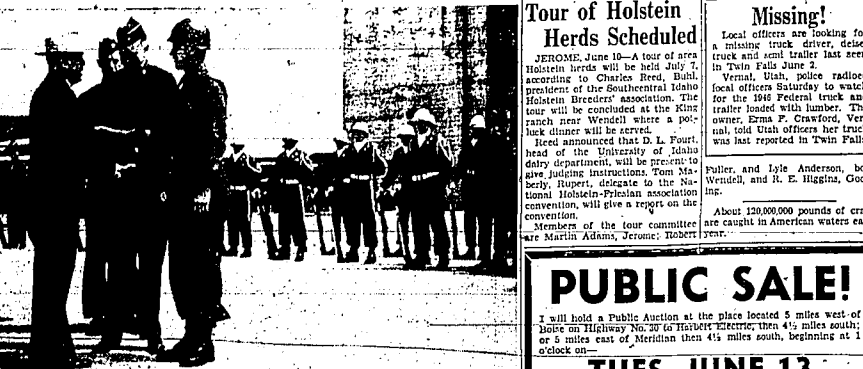
