### Spending Sealed in Report

WASHINGTON, June 16 (AP)—The committee of the House of Representatives today released a report on the federal deficit which shows that "boom" spending has increased in a "retarded" manner.

The report, which was prepared by the committee on the economy, states that the federal deficit for the first five months of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1950, was \$1.5 billion, or 1.5 percent of the gross national product.

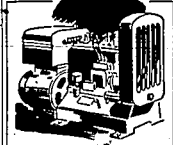
### 5 Makers of Cold Pills Okay Cease Of False Claims

WASHINGTON, June 16 (AP)—Five antihistamine manufacturers agreed today to stop claiming that the drug will prevent or cure a common cold.

The federal trade commission announced the agreement by the manufacturers to stop making unjustified claims for their products. They will not be prevented, however, from claiming that use of the drug checks, relieves, or in many cases stops "the symptoms of manifestations" of common colds such as sneezing or watering eyes or nose.

The agreement, which the FTC approved, ends proceedings started by the commission earlier this year against these companies and their antihistamine products.

The third complaint, filed against Herbert A. Wolff, asks \$40 the bank claims he owes on a promissory note due May 27, 1946. Eight per cent interest since April 27, 1946, and attorney's fees and costs are asked.
