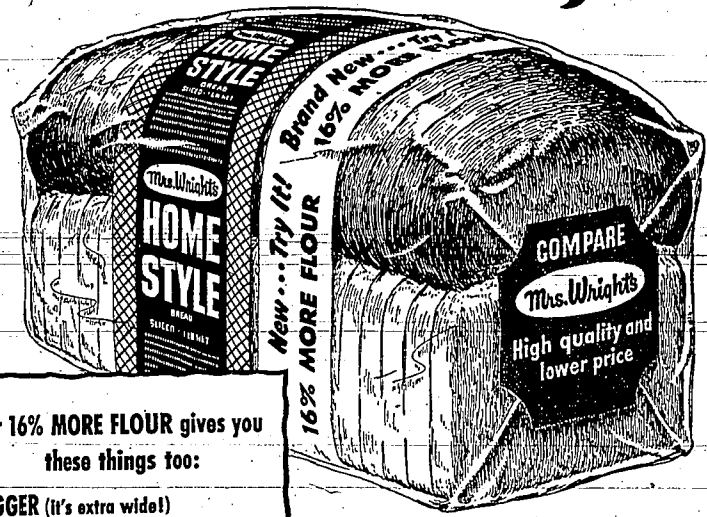

WASHINGTON, June 19—Federal officials are preparing to crack down on an expected national shortage of oleo butter as next month.

The food and drug administration will be urged today to start its preparations for the drive against "butterfingers."

There will be a price spread of nearly 40 cents a pound between the retail prices of butter and oleo margarine when the federal taxes are lifted.

Officials of the food and drug administration are known to have told senators behind closed doors that substitution of the cheaper product for butter, is difficult to detect.

When congress voted to end taxes on margarine this year, it set up a rigid set of regulations intended to make sure that consumers, restaurateurs and patrons of public eating places will know what they are buying.

Officials said the "expected butterfingers" will be sought to detect and prosecute successfully.
