Jerome Awakes To See Unique Visitor in Town

JEROME, June 20—A few early hours Monday morning in Jerome didn't know whether to run for their cameras or their guns as a large herd of spotted deer about 8 p.m. on the front lawn of the H. W. Grant residence on east avenue 10, Grand, Idaho, were seen to be in the act of eating the leaves of the trees and shrubs.

The deer apparently was undisturbed by all the attention as they moved slowly about, or very calmly stood perfectly still while the cameras clicked. A few of the older and more daring boys were in closer to the animal making him fear on his hind legs and then they waded off across the street to the Wilson Rupert residence and were over a high ridge.

When A. D. McKeon, who lives across the street from the Ruperts, appeared on the scene, he must have figured there was something "fishy" about the whole scene for he informed the state game farm of the incident and it wasn't long before William Gremel, manager of the farm, came around the corner with a pick-up, calmly walked up to the deer and hauled him into the back, tied him on with a rope and drove off.

"Though Gremel couldn't be reached," he said the deer had been missing from the farm for about a week. Those who missed him Monday morning may have a look at him there.

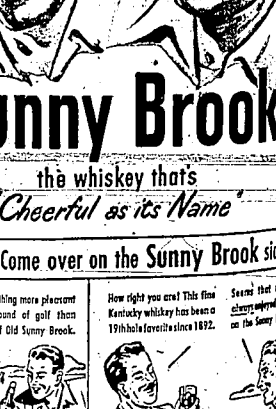
