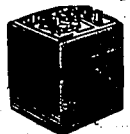

Next Move in Korea Crisis Up to Russia

President Truman and Premier Stalin are playing for keeps today as the checker board of diplomacy. It's Stalin's move.

He may ponder for quite a while before he makes it, for the stakes are high—the risk is a atomic war. Any small incident might convert this Korean war into a world war.

And he may... cause he finds himself in an unenviable position. Up until now the Russian strategy in the cold war has been to make a bold, audacious move. He has followed the lead on the defensive. That's the technique Moscow used in the Herfords—the seizure of Czechoslovakia and the conquest of China.

Table Turned

But this time Mr. Truman made the bold, sudden move. He ordered air and sea support for South Korea, and most of the non-Communist nations rallied to him. And Mr. Stalin has in front of him an American note calling on him to help halt the South Korean drive.

That note puts the issue squarely up to the Kremlin. It says that the world waits breathlessly for the answer. Stalin can take one of three broad courses of action.

Can't Fight

1. He can cut light and say nothing while the Korean peninsula is being fought in the air, and then say it had nothing to do with the invasion. And that didn't know anything about it until it happened. If the Korean note was to be taken as the establishment of another "people's republic" and making more plans.

2. Stalin can let Mr. Truman

Russia is not involved in the war, but the same time "send secret aid" to the Korean Reds. The way that probably would happen is that the "people's republic" would be able to speak very good Korean, and they would know how to maneuver a Yank fighting plane and be familiar with the inside of a tank. The chances are they would speak pretty good Russian.

3. Could Take Gamble

Mr. Moscow could take the big gamble that the Russian propaganda machine has gone into action. The Moscow radio today broadcast that the Reds would be attacking American and Russian pilots being falling in flames through Korean skies. It would be almost impossible to localize the war.

The Korean communists, much in the manner of the minute men of the American revolution, grabbed their guns and began defending themselves. They continued to defend themselves until they had smashed their way into the South Korean capital of Seoul.

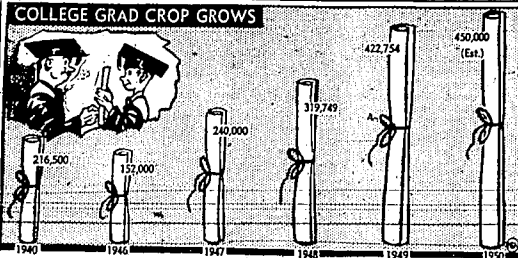

Official Raps Procedure in Grazing Fees

WASHINGTON, June 23 (AP)—A general accounting office attorney told a House committee the forest service has no right to take part of the grazing fees appropriated by law to the states.

The attorney, Charles E. Eckert, said laws passed by Congress in 1906 and 1916 require payment of 10 percent of all grazing fees collected on national forest lands to the states for the benefit of the counties in which the national forests are located.

"Hand in Till" Representative Enig, D. Calif., said that for 20 years the forest service has "put its hand in the till" taking about 20 percent of the receipts for range improvements and then appropriating to the counties 25 percent of the remainder.

Enig is a sponsor of a bill to reimburse 10 states for amounts totaling \$1,251,140 which his contends were withheld improperly.

Another witness, O. M. Granger, assistant chief of the forest service, was another witness at a House public lands committee hearing on the bill.

He denied there was any "monopolizing" or "illegally involved" in the practice of making deductions for range improvements. He said it was an "over-liberal interpretation of the law."

The committee deferred action.
