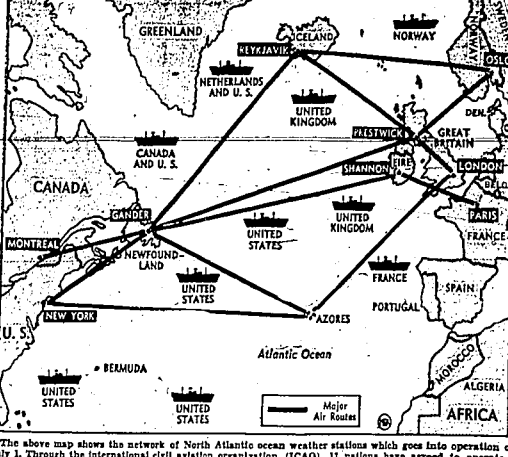

Pope Levels New Blow at Reds for Usurping Powers

VATICAN CITY, June 30 (AP)—Pope Pius, in a new blow against the communists in the United States, today said under major excommunication those who usurp the legitimate Catholic authorities and assume high pastoral office without Vatican approval.

The excommunication was issued by the Roman Curia in a secret congregation of the council, which regulates the discipline of bishops and priests.

The decree said persons who come within its scope incur major excommunication, which only the Vatican can lift.

It was a clear reply to the recent increase in persecution of Roman Catholic priests in Czechoslovakia, Hungary and Rumania, where new trials involving the clergy have been prepared.

Doctor Warns On Dangers of Bromides Use

SAN FRANCISCO, June 30 (AP)—A Chicago physician warned today that continuous and indiscriminate use of bromides may lead to mental disease so severe the user may have to go to a mental hospital.

Dr. Theodore Combs told the American Medical Association that bromides taken continuously remain in the body, accumulating to "demonstrable levels."

Bromides are compounds containing bromine, they are taken principally as sedatives.

"The reason is two-fold," he said. "People keep taking them without a let-up and they are excreted slowly. Large accumulations will make anyone ill."

It is surprising what a large number of people develop mental symptoms from bromides, with the cause going unsuspected, often badly enough to be sent to asylums.

Combs added that bromides can cause rashes which take on many forms. Also, bromide intoxication can be longer than effects from many other drugs, he said.

Combs urged that bromides be treated like habit-forming and sold only by prescription.

Quarters for the Sisters of St. Benedict's will be located on the basement floor. The heating plant will be in the basement beneath the north wing.

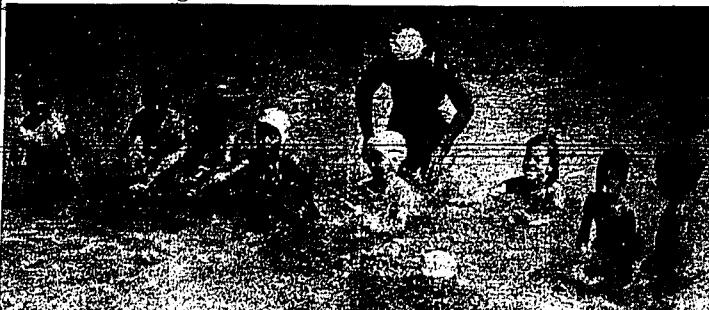

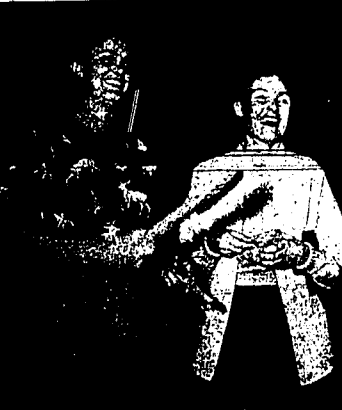

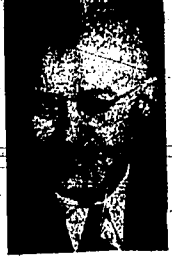

Truman Approves Bill for Delays in Assessment Work

WASHINGTON, June 30 (AP)—A bill giving miners on public land three more months to complete their annual assessment work was signed today by President Truman.

Basic mining law requires the claimants to mining rights on public land to perform \$100 worth of work on his property each fiscal year. The fiscal year ends tomorrow, June 30.

The measure signed today gives the claim owner until Oct. 1 to complete the work for the current fiscal year.

It does not apply to other years. To obtain the additional time, the claim owner must give notice by July 1 that he intends to take advantage of the new law.

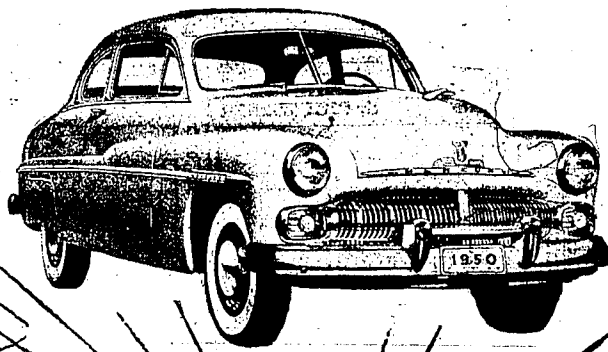
