ate of Polio Under Better Check in '50

YORK, July 7 (AP)—Polio seems to be under better control this summer than last, according to the National Foundation for the Fight Against Polio, which says that while the season still is young, the rate of infection is lower than in previous years.

Dr. W. H. Weller, director of the U. S. health service, says that in 1946, 17,000 cases of polio have been reported, somewhat less than the 20,000 reported in 1945. However, he says that in the first half of the year, 1946, the number of cases reported was about the same as in the first half of 1945.

City Health Officer W. H. Weller says that the serious epidemic hitting San Angelo, Tex., in 1945, is not being repeated in this community this year. He says that in many cases, particularly in San Angelo, Tex., which is still being hit by the epidemic, the disease was polio.

Elaborate Fireworks Display Planned By City at Frontier Field on July 4

One of the most elaborate fireworks displays in the history of Twin Falls will be touched off about 9 p.m. Tuesday at Frontier field, under the sponsorship of the city and the supervision of the Twin Falls Fire Department.

The fireworks arrived in Twin Falls Friday. Herrell Parzina, city recreation director and chairman of the fireworks display, said there are about 15 elaborate aerial displays and 15 large ground displays. The decision to sponsor a large fireworks display was made last month by the city commissioners to compensate for the city ordinance which bans the use of fireworks by individual children. It was City Manager William R. Smith who announced the plan to the city commissioners, that fireworks are too dangerous for general use around streets crowded with gasoline-fueled cars. But the city wanted to give youngsters and older people, too, a real display under proper supervision.

Traffic to the fireworks display will be directed by members of the Twin Falls County Mounted Police. The ground displays will be arranged in front of the stands at Frontier field so that spectators in the stands will receive the best view of the fireworks. Parzina said the "Bagbrush Ammer," Twin Falls women's mounted police, will lead the program by riding into the arena with American flags. City Manager William R. Smith will give the welcoming address.

Funds for the fireworks display were donated by the city, Chamber of Commerce, Junior Chamber of Commerce, Rotary club, Business and Professional Women's league, Scoutmaster club, Twin Falls Bank and Trust, and Fraternal-National Bank.

GREENWOOD, B. O., July 7 (AP)—Out of the rugged British Columbia interior has come a story of a woman's courage in attempting to save the lives of her husband and another man who were trapped in an old mine.

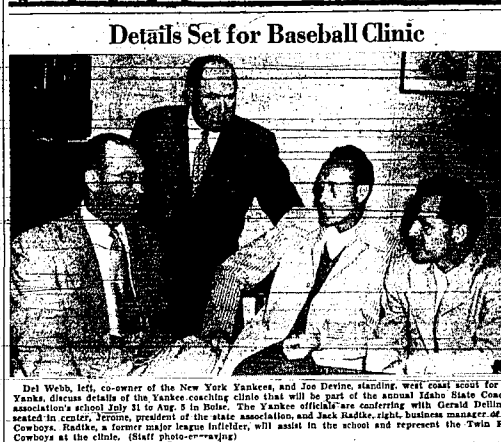
