One-Woman Band, 73, Uses Philosophy Of "You're Never Too Old to Have Fun"

She Has Fun at 73

"You're never too old to have fun" is the philosophy of Mrs. Laura Febush, 73, who loves to entertain folk with her musical renditions of old-time folk songs and dance tunes.

"This little white-haired lady can put more pep and swing into her music than the hottest jazz combo—and she needs no assistance from any assistants because she's an entire band herself."

Mrs. Febush's specialties are personal playing the harmonica, accordion and drum at the same time. She also plays the harmonica, piano and drum, and occasionally, and occasionally replaces her accordion with the guitar, which she strums with youthful vigor.

Her only complaint these days is that her fingers are getting stiff and she can't play her tunes as fast as she would like.

Mrs. Febush says she took up the musical instruments "just to be busy" but has since played 2500 sentimental numbers that bring back memories.

She likes to recall how she bought her harmonica with the first money she earned at the age of 14. She bought a cheap one, and worked toward the time when she had saved enough money to buy a cheap accordion. She was 20 then.

In 1915 she came to Twin Falls with her husband, William Febush, from Athlete, Kan. Her husband worked in town for 12 years and then they moved to a 15-acre farm south of Twin Falls where they resided until Mr. Febush's death in 1921.

Mrs. Febush, who has never had a more leisure and plays everything "by ear" did not take her playing seriously until 1930 when her husband bought a good accordion and she and her husband would entertain themselves and their friends by playing duets to the musical accompaniment.

In 1931 she added the drum to her one-woman band. Her friends leave her because she stamped her foot with every note she played. She was so pleased with her new instrument that she bought a new one, which she operates with her right foot.

Mrs. Febush's wife's wig about her apparatus which holds her harmonica in front of her mouth when she plays, leaving her hands free to play the accordion, piano or guitar. She poses her drum in place, with the piano, and "reads" she hasn't developed a "gadget" which will hold her drum.

During the past year the 73-year-old musician has appeared in programs at clubs, church meetings and Parent-Teacher meetings. In these appearances she plays all instruments except the drum, which she says is too large to carry around from place to place and would "look too silly."

Her favorite selections are "Goldene Slippers," "Spanish Cavalier" and "Brighten the Corner Where You Are." She is kept so busy gardening and working around her home during the summer that she has had no time to practice or learn new numbers. With determination she assures her friends that this winter she plans to expand her repertoire to include popular modern songs.

Following her husband's death Mrs. Febush hid away so much music that until January of this year when she and Mrs. Jane Gardner, who is a younger set of ladies assisting in programs together. Mrs. Gardner plays her instruments.

Mrs. Febush now lives by herself in a large, white, house on Pacific avenue east. Her musical instruments are kept close at hand so she won't miss an opportunity to "have some fun and entertain anyone who will listen."

She also collects antiques as a hobby and her living room and dining room are filled with cupboards and shelves displaying interesting antique china, glassware and figurines.

July 11 (AP)—Idaho's various tax sources for this year ending June 30 show a 1.4 per cent decrease of \$98,400 compared with the previous year.

Tale of Death and Small Boy Gives Strong Lesson for You

Editor's note: Every town has its little tale of tragedy. Not many deaths are written about there. Here are some that were written about in the Washington Daily News, but which could be read elsewhere with interest. They are not meant to be read as a lesson, but as a warning. You could even be the victim. It doesn't have to be your fault. It could be yours.

Death and a small boy have little in common—meeting seldom, and then only if by chance. So it is not surprising that Johnny Stibbi's family still cannot quite think of him as dead.

Johnny would have been 6 years old if he had not been run over by the truck.

Johnny Stibbi was a 10-pound baby when he was born, his mother remembers, and he was 10 months old when his father, a soldier, came back from overseas.

He was 3 years old when his mother, whose married life had become a nightmare to her, took Johnny and the new baby, Bobby, back home to live with her mother in Washington.

This is where Johnny began to grow up.

The house to his and stay and filled with sunlight. When the Stibbis moved in, it was already full of people — Johnny's middle-aged grandparents and his great-grandfather and several aunts and uncles who were many years older than Johnny himself.

It was a big, happy devout Catholic family and Johnny, who had a sort of inner brightness about him, became the center of it.

Johnny's mother, Bernadette, is a young, pretty girl with a fresh, open face like the cover on an outdoor magazine. When she talks about Johnny her face lights up and she laughs when she remembers how he ran.

"He was tired," his grandmother said. "I had carried him upstairs and put him on the bed. I started taking his shoes off and then I pulled his pants off and then quick—just like lightning—the truck hit shoes at me. He kicked with both feet, right in my stomach."

"He was awfully tired and all mixed up and I started to say something but he just lay there. I was holding him and he was going to die."

"Well, if you aren't the funniest looking dead guy, I ever saw!" I told him.

"I was so amazed. Because he was a 100 miles from dying."

"He would do that for you, Johnny's mother said."

"I was crying 'you'll be all right, the car is going to stop!'"

"That was about a o'clock Monday afternoon when Johnny came in. I was sitting here. I pulled my chair over to comb his hair."

"Johnny stepped back, brought his hands together anxiously, made a little bow and kissed his hand to her."

"That was the last time I saw him," Mrs. Stibbi said.

"Later, I heard he had been playing ball with some older boys and someone threw the ball at him and he missed it. Then he must have run out in the street. That's when it happened."

"I don't think I asked any more questions. That was enough."

"No, done men are with him."

"Mrs. Stibbi's father had just come home, and she was turned down. I'll be in the street and saw that little blond head sticking out of that blanket. I knew."

"As soon as we got home to give her his head, and I called to him, but he didn't recognize me."

"You'd better call in the squad car," a policeman told her.

"He was conscious," she said.

"You the policeman said."

"My first prayer was 'God, don't pull his pants off and then quick—just like lightning—the truck hit shoes at me. He kicked with both feet, right in my stomach.'"

"I was awfully tired and all mixed up and I started to say something but he just lay there. I was holding him and he was going to die."

"Well, if you aren't the funniest looking dead guy, I ever saw!" I told him.

"I was so amazed. Because he was a 100 miles from dying."

"I really began to pray fast. Just as fast and hard as I could."

"A woman asked me if I wanted a drink, but I didn't want one."

"I got in the ambulance with him, and the doctor was working on his lungs. We were just turning down 12th street when I saw his car was turning blue."

"He's not going to die, is he?" I asked the doctor.

"All right now, mother," he said. "I know what that meant. I'd have to leave my head if I wanted to see with him. The fire was going. But I didn't see it."

Mrs. Stibbi followed her boy into the hospital.

"They took Johnny right into the middle of the room and cut his shirt and fire underwear up the back, so he could breathe. There were five or six doctors there."

Later, Mrs. Stibbi joined her mother on a bench in the waiting room. Her mother wanted to go in to Johnny.

"You couldn't do any good," a policeman told her. "He wouldn't know you now."

Another policeman came up and asked Mrs. Stibbi some questions about Johnny. His name, his address.

Telling it, she struggled to keep herself composed.

"I'm sorry 'God is good,'" Mrs. Stibbi said. "Then I was putting a question mark on it. 'God is good.'"

"What I meant was 'God is wonderful' but what it came out was 'Is this what He means?'"

"Then I had an answer: right behind it, I had an increase in faith."

They brought Johnny Stibbi home to his father's house in a white sedan-lined casket. At first they wanted to dress him in his cowboy suit and bandana. But then they decided to dress him in an Elton coat, long gray trousers and white shoes. "Like he was going to church," that's the way it was.

Everybody sent flowers and all the kids came over from Parns school, the Negro school in the neighborhood. They were friends of Johnny's.

Mrs. Stibbi's wealth of white carnations was set over the casket, and Johnny's baby identification bracelet from Stibbi hospital was on his wrist.

"I really regarded that thing," Mrs. Stibbi says. "It was something special to me."

Johnny's brother, Bobby, is too young to understand most of this. He is aware that Johnny has gone somewhere, and seems to miss him; but he is happy, the way little boys usually are.

His mother is wearing white at Johnny's death.

"Johnny can't wear this shirt now," his mother says. "Just me."

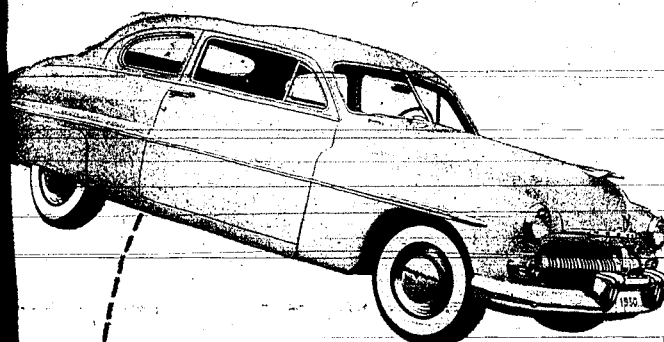

UP Reporter Reveals Why Reds Gaining

Editor's Note: United Press War Correspondent Peter Kalisher was one of the first American newsmen to go to North Korea in 1950. His reports of the last few days (see page 1) were so convincing that they led to a widespread belief that the Reds were gaining. This is why Americans are being shoved around.

TOKYO, July 11 (UP)—The North Koreans are not superior but so are they have been equipped with better and heavier weapons than the South American troops facing them. And there have been many more Communist than Americans.

The Red army Americans are being shoved around.

They witness the communist offensive from only two roads. The bold, tenacious tactics of the enemy are backed by tanks, guns, and artillery which the Yanks simply do not have in the field.

40-Tank
 One of the red's heaviest weapons is a Russian 40-ton tank, mounting a rapid-firing 76 or 85-millimeter gun. One of these tanks last week smashed an American 105-millimeter artillery emplacement like a marshmallow.

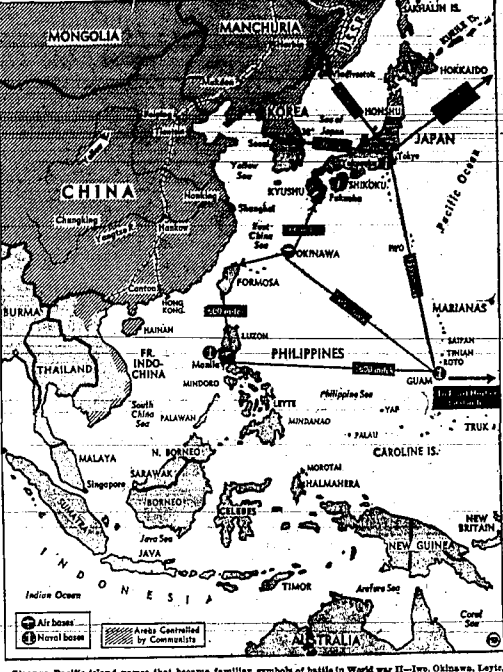
The Reds bring up anywhere from 10 to 30 tanks to the front under cover of darkness. Then they punch straight through along a main road, preferably in rain or cloudy weather when the American airplanes are blind.

These tactics overran American positions before the O's knew what was happening. Then it was too late for the air force to strike and the lines were too confused for safe strafing.

Removes Unaccounted
 Reports that thousands are missing tanks have been unaccounted for. One American sergeant who backpacked a tank said two Koreans jumped out of the cockpit vehicle. American military advisers who trained the South Korean army were fully unaccounted for both the equipment and training of an offensive weapon because narrow roads and heavy under fire do not make traditionally good tank terrain.

Maybe they don't in the book, but the North Koreans are writing their own.

Eyes on the Pacific

Eskimo Army Being Formed To Eye Coast

NOOME, Alaska, July 11 (UP)—An Eskimo army of more than 3,000 skilled Arctic hunters was being recruited and trained today to defend the strategic Alaska coastline opposite Siberia.

Eskimo scout battalions of the Alaska National Guard were being established at nearly every Alaskan village along the Arctic coast as far north as Point Barrow, at the top of the North American continent.

Eskimo Trained
 Eskimo men of military age were issued army uniforms, arms and equipment and trained to act as sentries, search and rescue units and possibly as guerrilla warriors.

Col. Joseph D. Alexander, veteran army officer in charge of organizing the guard, said that units were put on an "alert" basis as rapidly as they were ready for action.

The watch for any possible Arctic invader is maintained 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

 "The army is depending on the Eskimos to provide the permanent defense garrison—along thousands of miles of coastline which is less than 50 miles from Siberia to Alaska," Alexander said.

"As Arctic soldiers they will have no equals. They know how to survive in bitter Arctic cold and how to live off the country. Since they range far and wide in search of seal and caribou, any such Arctic invader would fall under their eyes very quickly."

Alexander said the Eskimos responded enthusiastically to the call for volunteers. So many wanted to join the guard there wasn't enough equipment to outfit them all. Recruiters who canvassed remote Arctic villages said not a single Eskimo refused to volunteer.

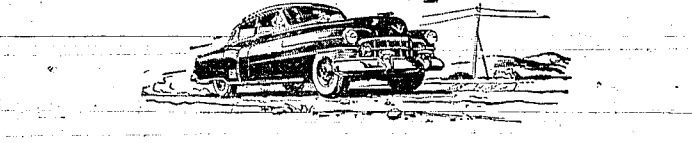
