Valley Boy Scouts 'Invade' New Orleans on Way Home

BY ROUTE WITH MAJOR VALLEY ANNUOUS SCOUTS RETURNED TO NEW ORLEANS AND WENT TO THE CITY OF THE MARCH 10th. The program of varied activities kept the Scouts from Twin Falls, Jerome, Blaine, and surrounding areas swarming like ants over the historic river port of New Orleans, La., Monday.

The Scouts were shown Napoleon House, where the emperor was held before he actually occupied the house. It still is named for him as a tribute to his memory. They also saw the old St. Louis Cathedral, the famous wrought-iron gate, the bridge, and the house of General Beauregard.

Riding on the bus, the boys passed down Bourbon street, past the Blacksmith Hoop of Pierre and Jean LaFite. This spot served as a base of operation in the practical activities of the two brothers. Near there is the old Abbatia house, which was frequented by the buccanniers and is still one of the dignified in present day life of the "Vieux Carre" or old quarter of New Orleans.

Before leaving the French quarter, the Scouts were taken to the old French market, which was a market place even before the settlement of the Spaniards. It later became the site of the slave market and at present is used for sale of all types of produce, live poultry, meats and fish.

Coffee houses were shown. The famous New Orleans coffee house, known as the "Marming Call."

Many of the boys took a two-hour bus tour through the city. The tour included a trip down Canal street, through the principal business section and then into the old French quarter.

In the French quarter, the real atmosphere of the city is found. One of the first stops on this tour was at the Cabildo, across from Jackson square on Chartres street. In this square, the military salute to the pirate, was held captive.

The same building has cells where runaway slaves were confined. On exhibition were waxen chains and neck bolts which were used on slaves to prevent their escape. The group also saw actual bills of sale for slaves sold to the slave markets.

Characteristic of the entire French quarter were the wrought-iron balconies on all the buildings. Many of them are decorated with peacock plants and birds with faded colors.

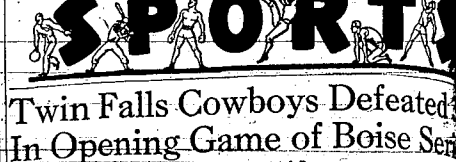

Navahos File Suit on U. S. For Damages

WASHINGTON, July 13 (AP)—The Navaho Indians today have filed with the government, charging it with fraud and mistreatment, a \$10,000,000 suit for damages.

The claim was filed with the Indian claims commissioner here by Norman Lital, acting as attorney for the Navaho tribal council.

The Indians claim the government deliberately ignored or broke treaties with the Navahos and "fraudulently" appropriated more than 20,000 square miles of the Navahos' best land in Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado and Utah.

Two treaties between the United States and the Navahos are mentioned in the suit, but it is estimated the Indians will receive more than \$10,000,000, plus interest, if they win.

The Navaho tribe also charged the government has (1) damaged Navaho reservation lands; (2) neglected the education and schooling promises in its various treaties; (3) appropriated Navaho natural resources and tribal property; (4) failed to supply miscellaneous services such as tribal machine shops and tools; (5) "fraudulently" stolen tribal funds from the Navahos; and (6) failed to pay the Navaho Indians for their considerable service in the war against the Apache tribe.

The Indians want "recognition and compensation for the various breaches, defections, wrongs and depredations from the standards of fair and honorable dealings" on the part of the government.

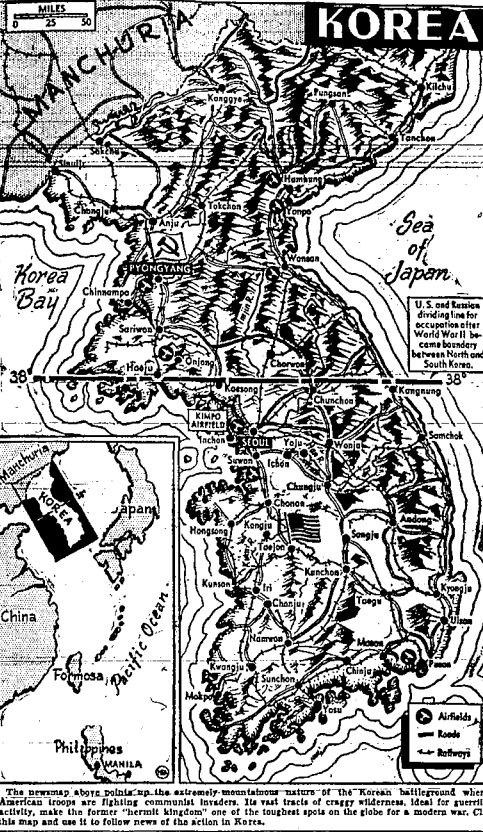

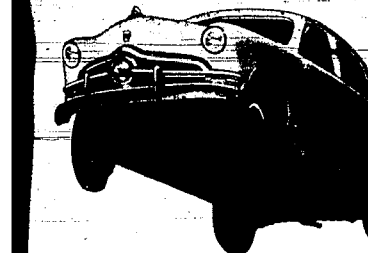

Time Noted in Major Quakes

Major quakes of the past year have been noted in a study made at the Institute of Geology and Mineralogy of the University of California at Berkeley.

The study, which was made by a team of geologists led by Professor Charles Richter, shows that major quakes occur at a fairly regular interval of about 18 months.

The study covers the period from 1947 to 1958, and shows that there were 11 major quakes of magnitude 7.0 or greater during this period.

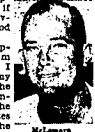
The quakes were distributed fairly evenly over the period, with the highest number occurring in 1952 and 1955.
