Small Courts Get Scrutiny Of Attorneys

BUT VALLEY, July 14 (AP)—The Idaho bar association today announced that it will hold a special meeting of the Idaho State Bar association.

Another speaker this morning was Atty. Gen. Robert E. Smylie, who addressed the delegates on "laymen in charge of the courts."

At yesterday's convention session, Claude V. Marcus, president of the state bar association, urged a change in methods of selecting trial and appellate judges.

The lawyer recommended that election of judges be shifted in favor of the "layman plan." Under this system, an impartial committee would select the three men to judge, who appoints the judge.

The people vote to retain or remove the judge only after a period of service.

Marcus also stressed the need for strict rules of procedure for the laymen to be prescribed by the supreme court. He specifically proposed shorter and simpler forms for pleadings and pre-trial conferences.

"The judiciary has confirmed the inherent power of the supreme court," to prescribe rules of procedure, Marcus said. "This has not been accomplished. We are filling the courts with the kind of men who have no training and no experience."

Close validity of the present system on the part of the defendant will go a long way to make the trial a fair trial, he said.

Frank H. Mink, Caldwell, proposed to amend the constitution of Idaho. He said disinterested on part of laymen in handling the trial of cases is hindering the right of legal practice and called for the state supreme court to change the situation and protect the public from activities of laymen in the legal field.

Attorneys Urge CPA Auditing of Public Accounts

BUT VALLEY, July 14 (AP)—The Idaho Prosecuting Attorneys association urged legislation requiring all public accounts to be audited by certified public accountants.

The action was taken at a meeting held in conjunction with the Idaho bar association convention.

Howard B. Adams, Shoshone, was president of the prosecutors' group. Other officers named are J. Henry O'Donnell, Moscow, vice president; George E. Beckford, Tully, secretary; and John M. Sharp, Idaho Falls, treasurer.

Adams appointed an advisory council of Earl W. Morgan, Lewiston; W. W. McDonald, Arroyo; and Joseph McLaughlin, Healy. All are retiring officers.

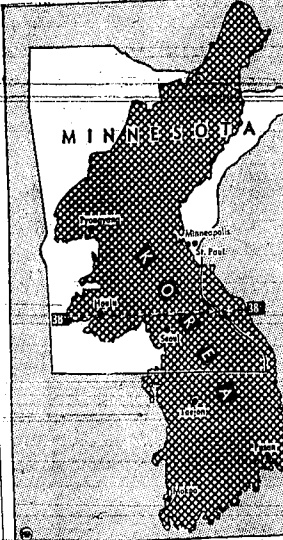
