George Vaughn, candidate for the Republican nomination as governor, said he supports federal and state aid to schools, under state supervision; equal enforcement of all laws; adequate help for the aged; and cooperation between labor and management.

He said he believes the state should be in charge of the construction pay-as-we-go plan for state highways. Highway department employees should be reduced during the depression, he added.

O. J. Bonham, Twin Falls candidate for the second district congressional nomination, said the people of America should become "concerned about their freedom. Political practices should not be accepted because 'free enterprise' has proved that it is the best system in the world," Bonham said.

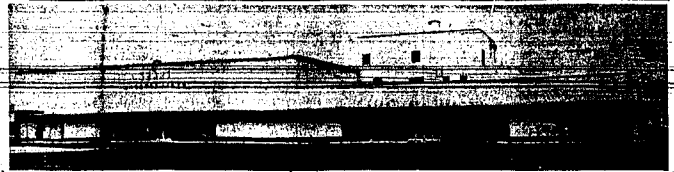

as he progressed with it. The house is finished and painted white with a green roof and yellow shutters. Letters "J" are painted on the shutters and on gates of the house.

Since the house was completed, Jack has "redone" the downstairs four times. This work was done through experimenting with various types of wallpaper as well as checking the advisability of using wallpaper directly on the finished wood or the use of plaster for the walls, which finally won out.

An unusual feature of the house is the hanging of the floors so the top story can be played in just by unhooking the roof. The second story, in like manner, folds back to reveal the first floor.

Outside, there are six sidewalks, front and back, flowers in the flower boxes and flower beds around the house. Small pine trees complete the landscaping. Even the garage is equipped with a "jello." All of the tiny windows were cut by the builder, who said that the most difficult part of the building was having to use such small nails.

Jack will be a sophomore in high school this fall.

In his room, which he painted and prepared himself, is the headboard for his bed, which he designed and built. He used only a coping saw to cut the scalloped frame, which has seven cleverly-arranged nooses for his radio, books and other items. Because of the wood left over from the headboard, went into two wondrous table lamps for his room.

The big-headed project contained three days, including varnishing in natural shade.

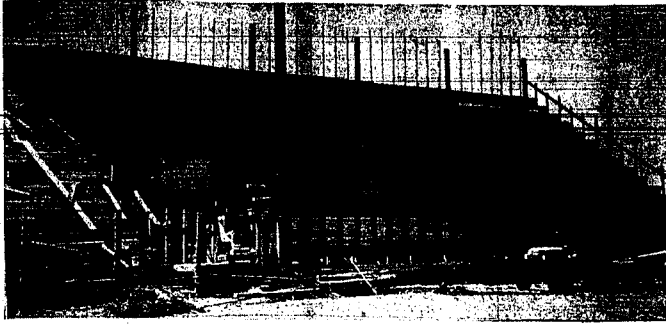

800-Seat Addition to Stands Being Built at Fair Grounds

If rodeo sports at the Twin Falls county fair, Aug. 28-Sept. 2 can find a seat in the grandstands it won't be the fault of Thomas Parks, secretary of the fair board.

Parks, 2, W. Adams and several part time employees have been laboring for the last two months to construct a new addition to the grandstands. When completed around Aug. 1, the addition will seat 800 persons and will make a total seating capacity of 6,500 for the stands.

This addition is 50 feet long and 30 feet high. It contains 14 rows of seats. Each seat is 20 inches wide and 17 inches high. An innovation on the new stands eliminates the two bottom tiers and substitutes a walk way and a wall in front of the stands which is six feet eight inches high.

Concrete foundations for the stands contain 45 tons of concrete. Parks said.

The main day so far has been in obtaining enough workers to get the job done. Estimated cost for the addition is \$40,000, which will come from the fair board's building fund, Parks said.
