Eccles Urges Moves to Halt U.S. Inflation

BALTIMORE, July 19 (AP)—Members of the Federal Reserve board believe deflation is developing rapidly because of the Korean crisis. A statement has proposed the inflation be checked through a program of credit control and reduction of civilian demand for goods. The program... Eccles, a member of the Federal Reserve board of governors and former Utah banker, suggested this fiscal program for the government: 1. Maximize production of goods. 2. Reimpose a corporation excess profit tax of 75 percent on all net earnings above 10 percent of the first \$50,000 of interest capital and 50 percent on any balance, allowing \$500,000 maximum. 3. Repeal organized labor law. 4. Close tax loopholes. 5. U. S. Treasury to offer non-market investors long term non-market bonds with 10 percent interest rate at 2 1/2 percent.

He attended school at Amsterdam, American Falls, Burley and Mountain Home high schools. Landers' father, Leroy M. Landers, is a plumbing foreman at the Anderson dam.

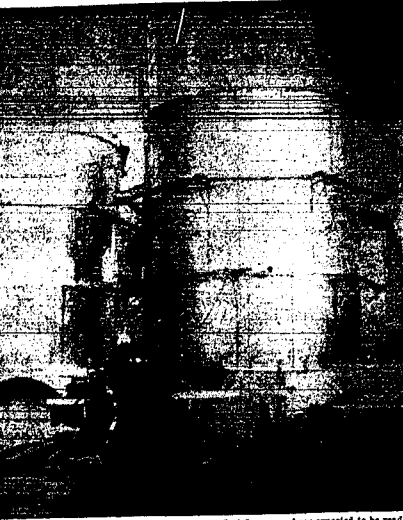

Two Tanks for Grain Storage Under Construction in Jerome

JEROME, July 10—Two steel grain storage tanks under construction by the Grinnell Warehouse company, Inc., will be ready in 10 days to receive grain. Page Feltow, in charge of construction, said the tanks are a representative of the bulk manufacturing company which is installing the 3. H. Wine and Son construction company, Boise, contractors of the job.

The tanks are 10 feet high with 9-foot concrete bases and are 14½ feet in diameter. Topping the tanks will be a 24-foot head house, oval in shape, 9 by 14 feet. The head house will contain machinery for elevating the grain and diverting it into the desired tank.

The two tanks will hold 20,000 bushels of grain and are being built at an approximate cost of \$35,000.

The tanks are the largest of their kind in 108 feet in the air, higher than any building in Jerome.

To complete the work more quickly, two working shifts began Tuesday morning, one at 4:30 a. m. and the other at 1:30 p. m.

These tanks are located next to the bean storage warehouse built by the company last year.

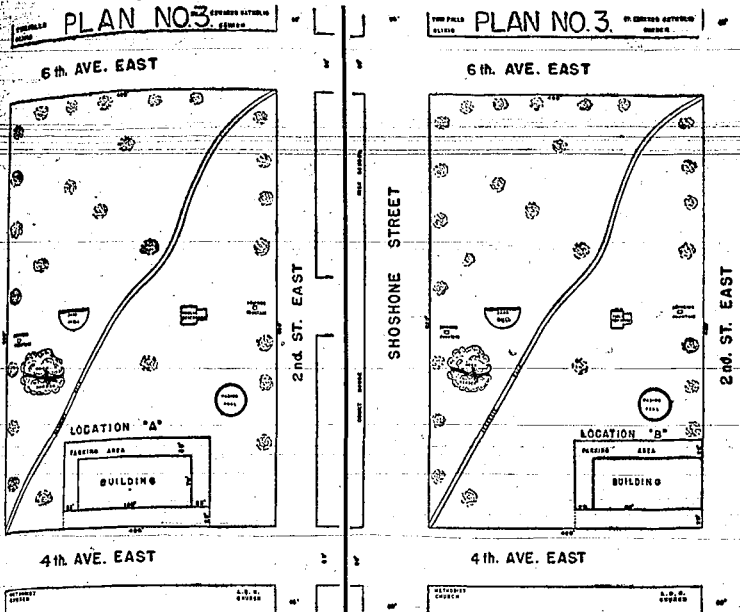

City Park Offers Two Sites for New Structure



Locations in City Park Proposed for Building Site; Straw Ballot to Follow

The city park, facing Fourth avenue east, has been proposed for the new building site. The other site interferes with existing facilities of the park, such as the rock and water pool. Other sites covered in two previous articles and sketches are in the new mall.

Any of the two possible locations in the city park would interfere with existing park facilities, such as wading pool and rock garden.

Naturally, the most immediate objection to building the city hall in the park would be that it might detract from the appearance of the park, a somewhat unusual feature to be located near the center of the city of Twin Falls. Another point of view would be that a well-designed city building would add to the park's natural attractiveness.

From the financial point of view, Twin Falls would realize \$50,000 from sale of property owned on Second avenue east, without using any of that amount to buy a new site. As has been pointed out in previous articles, Cityway east has offered \$50,000 for the city-owned property on Second avenue east.

Of the total area of the park, 948,000 square feet, the city building would occupy only 21,000 square feet of space if located in the center of the block and only 22,000 square feet on the corner location.

An obvious advantage of the street park site is its proximity to the courthouse where similar business is transacted. People doing business at both the courthouse and city hall could complete their business with one stop. But the park location automatically would place the city building near centers of traffic congestion.

However, the most important factor in the desirability of erecting a building in the city park would be the building and adjacent facilities detract from or add to the beauty and atmosphere of relaxation in the park?

Don't forget to register your preference in the straw ballot to start tomorrow in the *Times-News*. This paper volunteered to present all the data on locations under consideration. The board of city commissioners believing that residents of Twin Falls should have a voice in selecting the building site, will hold a public hearing on the straw ballot.

Regardless of location of the city hall, the present city building would be devoted to expansion of the police department, now operating under a handicap because of a shortage of space.

Trailer Park Construction Started Here

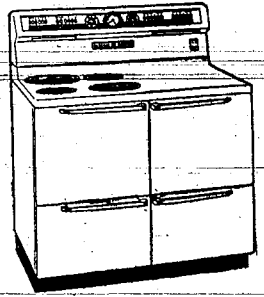
Construction of a large trailer park by Larry Boyd, on land crossed by the bend in Rock creek just west of the hospital on highway 30 is progressing rapidly.

Boyd said Wednesday that trailers should begin using the park within the next few weeks. The property, water lines are being laid and installation of plumbing has begun in the utility house.

The park will consist of 60 lots 25 feet by 35 feet arranged in four parallel rows. Between the rows of lots will be east and west streets 30 feet wide to provide plenty of room for passing and parallel parking. Grass and trees will be planted as soon as the land is prepared, Boyd said.

He said future plans might include a large drive-in hotel to be constructed in the 300 feet by 400 feet area which will be left vacant next to the highway. Such a hotel might include 50 to 80 rooms, he said.
