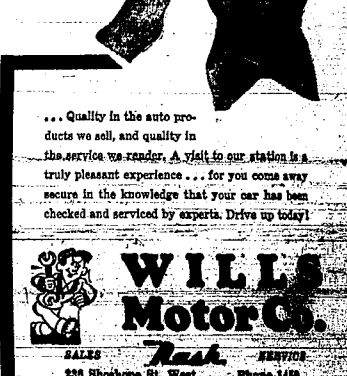

Even Tokyo Seems Unruffled Despite Korea War Nearness

"TOKYO, July 21 (AP)—The Korean war somehow seems almost as far away from Tokyo as it does from New York or Washington. This is odd considering that a jet plane can fly from here to the warfront in less than the time it takes a man to smoke a 10-cent cigar. But an air of so-called confidence has replaced the gloom that greeted the first weeks of fighting. There is probably less concern here than in the Pentagon.

The turning point was the landing of fresh American divisions on the eastern Korean coast above the vital port of Pusan. There is a feeling in the United Nations forces now cannot only hold a bridgehead—they may even shortly undertake offensive action of at least limited nature.
