Vocational Agriculture Plant At Burley Nearing Completion

BURLEY, July 23—Construction of the new vocational agriculture building at Burley is being completed this week and is ready for the installation of furnishings, Bernell Wright, superintendent, has announced. The one-story brick building is 120 feet long and 80 feet wide, and was built by Brennan and Cahoon, constructionists. The building includes a double classroom unit for vocational agriculture, a 50-foot by 80-foot shop, an instrumental music room, 32 by 88 feet, and a 22 by 32-foot classroom.

Clover Farm Bureau Raps Brannan Plan

CLOVER, July 22—The resolutions drafted by the effective of the Brannan plan were adopted Friday at the July meeting of the Clover farm bureau. The resolutions passed that the Clover bureau's opinion: (1) the bill inserted that farmers are unable to think clearly because of the law of supply and demand is not in agreement with the fact that the plan was "contrived without consultation with either congressional or farm organization leaders," (2) that planned economies are not in agreement with farmers and (that the farmers) are aware that irrespective of price level, the law of supply and demand still determines price, and (3) that agricultural workers, by able bi-partisan congressional and farm leaders have been "unfairly attacked and criticized without giving them a trial run."

The Clover bureau recommended the county bureau that "no steps be undertaken to deliver the truth concerning the sound and fair farm support program to the nation, urban and industrial people of the country." The resolutions and recommendations were drafted and presented by Melvin Jagals, Buhl, to be presented to the county board Monday night. Leslie B. Thomson, organization director of Mayo Valley, reviewed the two school of thought on the farm problem and announced that Alan B. Kline, president of the American Farm Bureau, would speak at Twin Falls on Aug. 9. Max Lloy, Twin Falls attorney, also presented his opinions on the Brannan plan.

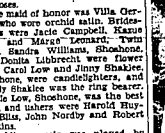

Chart Shows Pay Scale for Enlisted Men and Warrant Officers

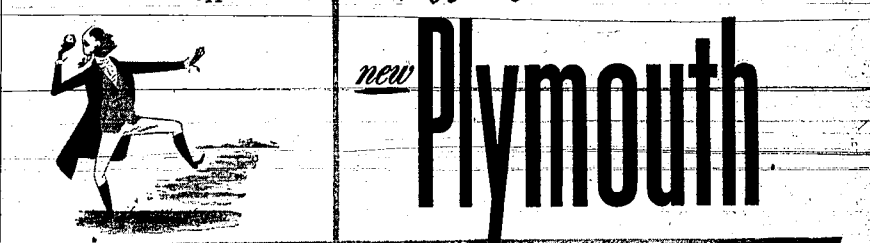

Pay scales for enlisted men and warrant officers of all branches of the military service are shown in this chart...

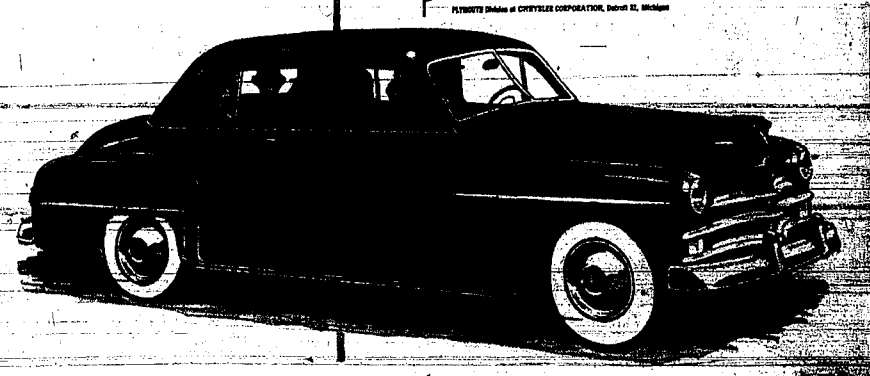

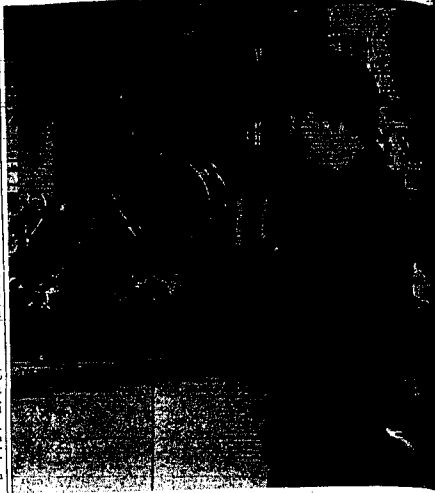
