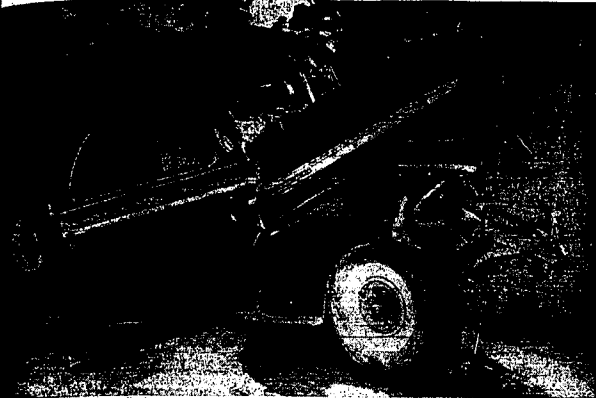


## Tourists Injured Critically When Car Smashes Into Tree

Two tourists were reported in critical condition at the Twin Falls hospital Tuesday night as a result of their car accident on mile 20 of the Twin Falls Tuesday morning. The car, driven by Marvin C. Wright, was reported to have struck a tree and overturned.

The injured individuals are Andrew J. Harness, 21, route 1, Dayton, Ore., Bonnie Harness, 19, his wife, and Marvin C. Wright, 22, Truckman, Ark. Harness' condition is conceded no chance to survive, according to hospital attendants.

Richard A. Arpelt, 14, Baker, driver of the second car involved, was not injured.

# 5-Billion Boost in Wage And Corporation Levies Is Sought by President

WASHINGTON, July 25 (AP)—President Truman asked congress today for a prompt \$5,000,000,000 increase in taxes, to be collected partly from individuals and partly from business.

He proposed the higher taxes on individuals start coming out of paychecks received after Oct. 1. He said the new withholding rate should be 18 per cent instead of 16 per cent on that part of wages subject to withholding.

As a letter to Speaker George D. Ga. Mr. Truman proposed that a tax bill already passed by the house be used as a peg for immediate action. That bill is now before the senate finance committee, headed by George F. Pepper.

## House Okays Enlistment 'Freeze,' Bill to End Armed Force Ceiling

WASHINGTON, July 25 (AP)—The house passed today a bill to freeze enlistment in the armed forces and a bill to end the ceiling on the size of the armed forces.

The measure freezing enlistment in the armed forces is a bill to prevent normal expiration date.

Both bills were passed by voice vote without opposition.

President Truman asked for prompt action on the measure in a special message to congress last night.
