WASHINGTON, July 28 (AP)—The army plans to step up its total strength to 834,000, an increase of 240,000 officers and 760,000 men, according to Representative Vinson, announced today. Vinson announced today that President Truman's additional budget request of \$1,600,000,000 for fiscal 1951, chairman of the house armed services committee, J. Lawson Collins, chief of the staff, would be \$400,000 more than \$1,500,000.

Senators Predict Reactivation of Mtn. Home Base

WASHINGTON, July 28.—Senators Dworkin predicted the new active Mountain Home airbase will be used as the first field to be used as the air force expands.

He said Maj.-Gen. William F. McGee of air force headquarters told him the entire program is under study and there has been no decision as yet to activate war field.

Chairman Vinson, D., of the house armed services committee, said yesterday an expansion of the air force to 60 groups is planned.

Dworkin told a reporter that any expansion beyond the present 44 groups will make additional bases necessary.

"It is likely, when and if this occurs," Dworkin said, "that Mountain Home will be considered. Its runways and facilities are equal to those of any other base in this country."

Bold Cancer Fight Method Is Explained

LONDON, July 28.—Bold new attempts to fight cancer with peacetime radioactive atoms from atomic energy were described today by the sixth international congress on radiology.

Radiocesium, gold is injected by needles into the abdomen to combat cancer which has spread through the area.

Radioactive or "hot" atoms of such common things as sodium, bromine, or cobalt are put inside plastic bags which then are placed inside cancer ridden bladder.

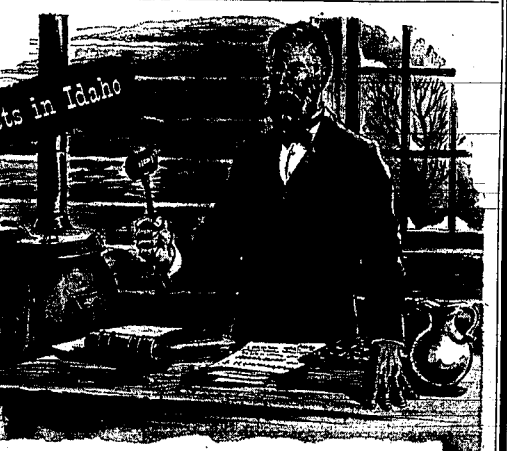

WASHINGTON, July 28 (AP)—Despite price increases since the start of the season, farm product prices have reached levels which would make them subject to ceilings if the government has power to control prices.

Defense Measures Opposed by Clark, Senator Declares

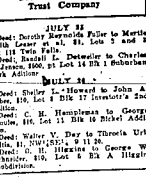
