

Russia Demands U.S. Withdrawal From Battle Area

WASHINGTON, Aug. 4 (AP)—Russia today demanded the immediate withdrawal of all United States troops from Korea as part of a two-point Soviet security council to hear both sides and exercise its veto power unless the council resolution was laid before the 11 nation security council by Jacob A. Malik as chairman.

Malik said, "I wish a security council will adopt a resolution to prevent the escalation of hostilities and withdrawal of U. S. troops from Korea."

Castleford Trio Ends Bruneau Canyon Trip

CASTLEFORD, Aug. 4—A pair of broken glasses, lack of food and too many rattlesnakes brought to an unsuccessful and the second conquest of Bruneau canyon Monday but the three explorers didn't return to Castleford until Thursday night.

Miracle left the food at the crossing under the impression that the first men were Leonard and Stanley Miracle and John Hughes who had entered the canyon on an expedition trip three days before Thornton and his companions. Another boy, Kenneth Smith, also spotted the Castleford men in the canyon on a previous trip. Smith had made the mistake of believing them to be the brothers and Hughes, and the boys had been in the canyon so long, the fire rangers, and some days had passed only 20 or 30 miles from one end to the other, they probably would be lost.

Arthur and Kenneth Miracle went for some time Sunday night and Monday at the crossing but the boys carrying the three men did not return. Meanwhile, the Twin Falls trio had successfully completed their trip and were back home.

Yanks Stop North Korean Drive Toward Pusan; Army Reserves To Be Called up in September

WASHINGTON, Aug. 4 (AP)—The army today called on 62,000 non-organized reserves to report during September and October for 21 months of active duty. The plans call for 32,000 to be in camp by Sept. 15. The remaining 30,000 are to report by Oct. 15.

The reserves will be called "with or without their consent" from both the untested and inactive reserves.

First calls go to those between 19 and 25 years old.

Priority will be given to those by the number of dependents. Those with no dependents will be called first, those with one dependent second, and those with more, last.

The army said that the call will be made primarily to bring to full strength the national guard and organized reserve units ordered to active duty and "to perform other duties essential to the current military expansion."

This call was the first active mobilization of reserves not in organized units.

Mainly Veterans
The bulk of these enlisted reserves are World War II veterans. They number about 185,000.

No officers are affected by this call.

The enlisted reserves being ordered to duty will come from throughout the nation.

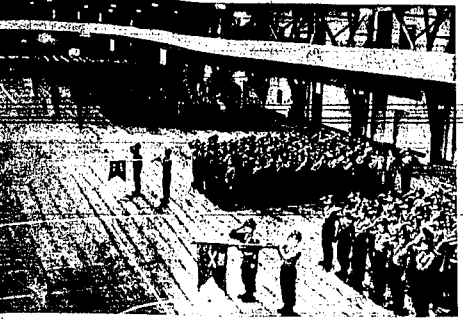

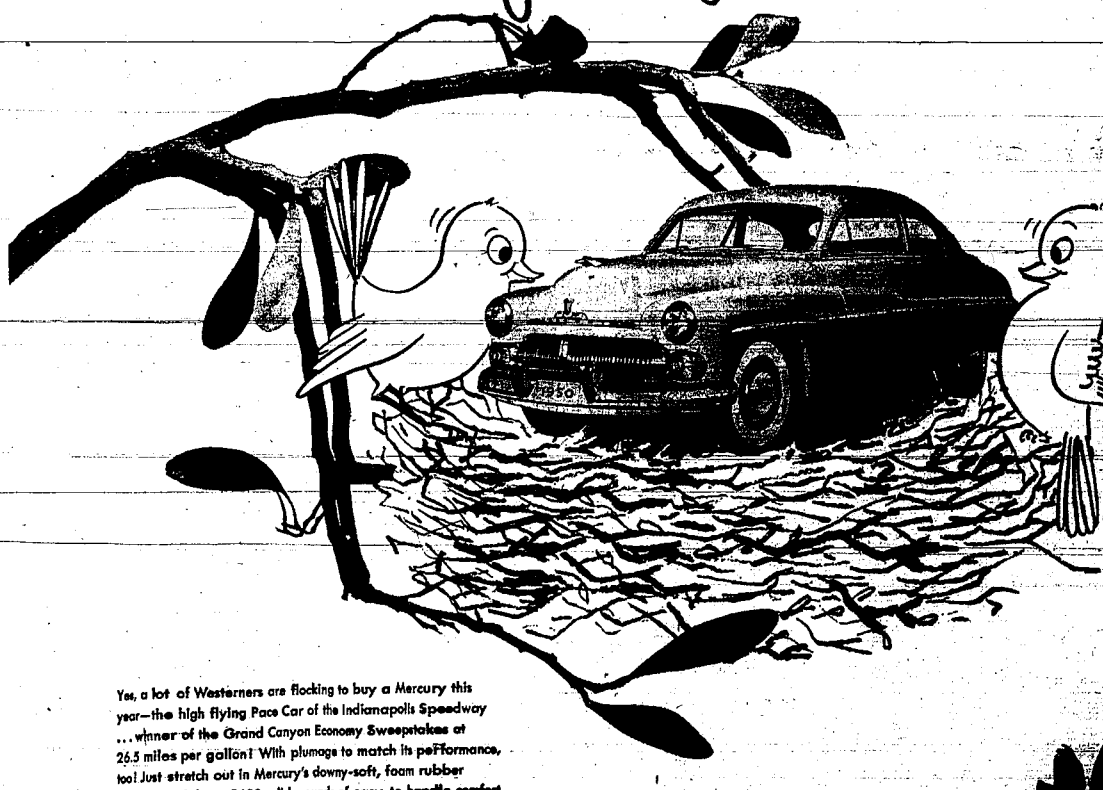

The horse bolted and dragged Nathan three quarters of a mile before the rope attached to the boy wore thin and broke. Nathan was dead when his playmate finally reached him.


