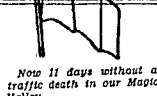

Senator Dworshak Refutes Unfounded Charges

"During political campaigns, charges frequently are made by candidates, but up to the present time I have made no effort to sue such charges against me. However, when anyone is accused of being responsible for the tragic Korean situation, it is time to examine the facts."

"I am accused of having opposed aid to China. Here are the facts: June 15, 1948, H. R. 6801, the Foreign Aid Bill, was approved by a vote of 60 to 9. I voted 'yes.' This bill became Public Law No. 80th Congress on June 28, 1948. This act included \$400,000,000 of aid to China. This money was expended reluctantly by the administration and now, two years later, there is \$90,000,000 remaining."

"I am accused of having voted against building up our air force. The facts: On May 6, 1948, H. R. 6226, the Supplemental National Defense Bill, funded \$22,000,000 contract authority to provide for airplanes building toward a 70-group air force. The Senate by overwhelming majority approved this bill and I voted 'yes.' Previously this bill was before the Senate Appropriations Committee, the roll call showed that I voted for the 70-group air force, only one member of the committee voted against it."

"It is charged that I am so far to the right and Glen Taylor as to be left that we voted together. The records in Congress from which the voting facts are taken show that on these two bills I voted 'yes' and Senator Taylor voted 'nay.'"

"It is also claimed that I have refused to commit myself on any program. Of course, this is in conflict with the record. Although I myself have favored economy in appropriations for both foreign and military defenses, I have consistently supported adequate military economic preparedness for our country."

"It is unthinkable that unfounded claims should be made and then refuted by roll-call records. Such misstatements are made with confidence that Idaho voters, exercising fairmindedness, will repudiate unfounded and intemperate charges made in this political campaign."

Right to Old Job Is Outlined Here

Judy Leaves Sun Valley After Rest

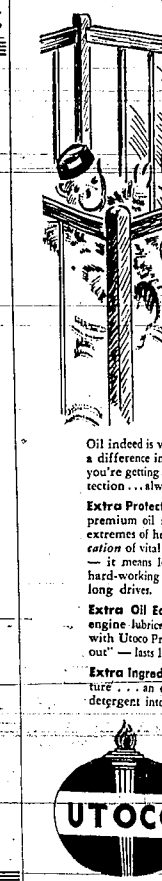
