Special Perfection Parsons was trying to produce better money than the treasury department's and U. S. District Attorney Donald Watson. After talking with the agents on the case, it is his opinion that if the plates had fallen into the hands of some counterfeiting prodigy more interested in quantity production than quality, the counterfeit bills would have had a drastic effect on our monetary system.

Parsons never attended high school, made the St. Louis public library his classroom and studied such subjects as calculus, chemistry and engraving. The ten dollar counterfeiters engraved on bond-like paper obtained by bleaching real one dollar bills. Parsons makes numbers each with ultra-serial numbers each week. Using expensive chemicals, he managed to make the serials so close that his bills lack perfection.

Parsons was slightly dazed, the secret service had turned up \$11,000 worth of the counterfeit money and scores of counterfeiters are accused of passing in 23 states. Parsons is a fugitive, who took down an auto license number led to the arrest.

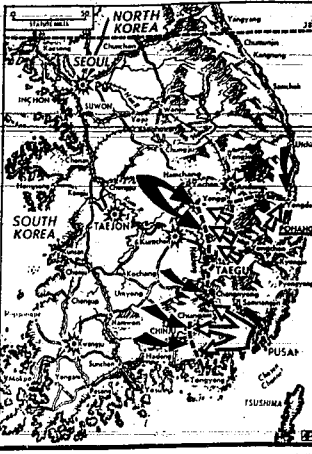

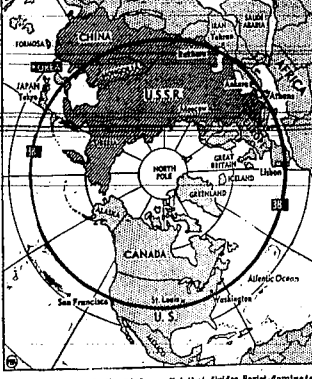

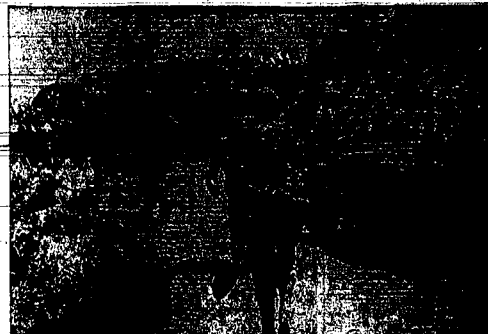

### Russ General Leads Koreans; Fight Won't Delay Tito Moves

PARIS—A high ranking Soviet army officer named Mas-Gai, P. A. (Mas-Gai is the actual commander-in-chief of the communist forces now fighting in Korea, according to well-known communist circles in Paris. Before assuming command Mas-Gai was chief of the Korean widespread network of secret troops and command detachments in western Europe. Although Mas-Gai is a general, he is known to be one of Moscow's foremost experts in guerrilla warfare.

General Mas-Gai is at present reported to be in northern Korea, where he heads a force of 200 red army officers and military experts of the command.

The chief of the "political" general at the moment to fire the first shot which might be the prelude to world war. This is expected in communist circles as a distinct victory for the pro-war group in the Soviet hierarchy.

Prior to his recent death at the age of 80, Zhukov, who headed the uniform when it broke with Marshal Tito, was widely regarded as Stalin's successor. He is a bitter rival of Malenkov.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 10 (AP)—President Truman, said Wednesday the United States must do more to help the physically handicapped as well as the mentally retarded to overcome the forces of tyranny and oppression.

"It is every important to me that all its employment and all service contracts should employ handicapped persons," Truman said.

Addressing the sixth annual meeting of the President's committee on national employ, the physically handicapped week, Mr. Truman said:

"Today we are confronted by forces which have little or no regard for the value of human life. We are confronted by those who think of human lives only in terms of power . . .

"On our society, on the other hand, human life is a unitary precious."

He designated the week beginning Oct. 1 for a special appeal for the employment of persons with physical defects.

Mr. Truman presented awards to four young women who finished high school age contests, who were invited to Washington by the Disabled American Veterans and the International Association of Handicapped.

The President warmly greeted the prize winners, including Capt. Welch, an aviator, and Miss from Tampa, Fla., who celebrated her seventeenth birthday Wednesday.

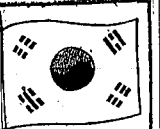

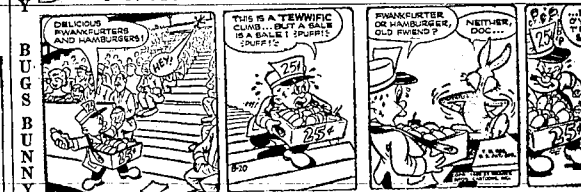

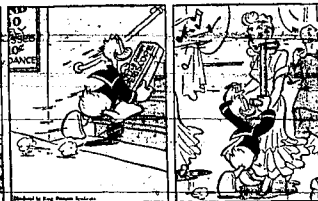

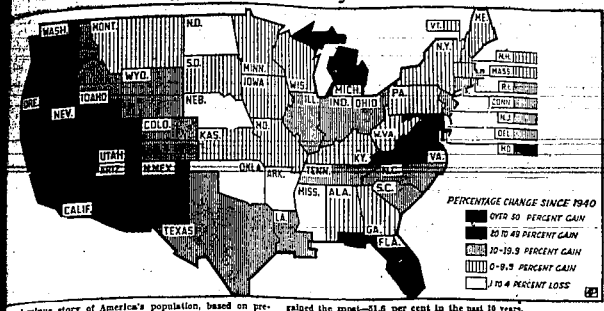
