Last Precinct Gives Blaine Vote Reports

HAYLEY, Aug. 11.—With the results of the election in Hudson precinct in Blaine county reported Thursday night, Magic Valley had a clean slate. The small Blaine precinct was the last to report.

Democratic voters—504 of them in Hudson—voted for J. D. Worth Clark for the six-year term ending in 1952. A total number of votes in the county for all 460 Old Time voters' total was 1,000. The vote was as follows: Clark, 504; Republican, 496.
