Counties to Hold Fairs in Magic Valley Between Aug. 17 and Sept. 9

On Oct. 19, 21, 23, in 1950, residents from all over southern Idaho gathered by means of buses and truckloads to witness a "repeated program which includes horse racing, stock and agricultural exhibits, fruits," Andre Lounsbury, chairman, was president of the fair that year.

Others helping were W. C. Pratt, vice president; James D. Hill, secretary; Willis Jackson, field vice president; George A. Anderson, treasurer, and W. H. North, secretary.

Aside from the officers, directors included A. Nelson, C. O. Demaree, L. D. Bowman, W. C. Dolecek and Joe Parker. The slogan for the fair was "A United Fall Gives Power."

A few days following the fair, the "Albion Nugget" reported that "the success of the annual fair was due to Mrs. C. H. Polly, Burley; Mrs. Rex, Mrs. Hagar, Mrs. Florence Hertz, Astoria; Mrs. R. A. Bredner and Mrs. Burstrom.

When William K. Borch was introduced as speaker, all Congressman Hamer and Prof. Frandsen of the university. There were motorcycle races, trotting, packing, football and a tag-team.

Those getting an extra thrill went to the Albion Normal auditorium to see "Hot Lynx," a motion picture, "Jack O'Diamonds" and other attraction.

Two years later, Sept. 26 through 30, Cassia county residents again gathered at Albion for the third annual fair. The slogan for this year was "More Fun, Better Living than Ever."

Fair officials advertised attractions to include: "Five balloon ascensions, show trees, a ladies' rest tent, and barrels of hot water. There will be amusements, games, horse races, foot races, bronco busting, roping and football."

A Lounsbury, president, announced that the Oakley Silver Band will fill the air with music. John Northman and Jim Durfee directed the horse races and the cattle at the fair.

One of the members of the "Oakley Silver Band" was Albert Bates, now Cassia county sheriff and secretary of the present fair board.

The trip to the Albion fair in 1911 proved to be a painful one for Clark. "I think on the way we got in a mud-hole, a member of the Oakley Silver band was thrown from his buggy and sustained serious injuries," Clark said.

Clark was in the same rig and reported the same injuries. "The rig was attempted to pass another conveyance carrying band members and a race horse. The team was getting in a good speed when the driver turned the rig to the left and the rig was running into a wire fence and overturned the buggy."

The second big parade of the fair was a baby show.

Two years later, Oct. 21, Burley, Idaho, held a fair with officials out to "do things differently. A small grandstand was erected and the fair was held in a stand placed in front of what was then a barn.

E. Myers, owner of the fair, had two winners, because as Myers said, "I had a white foal that carried the furthest."

Levi Savage, another old timer, then won the bidding.

The Schodds boys, veteran cattle raisers from across Idaho, were the winners of the trophy for the early rodeo, securing the ranges for the fair, because they had the first two winners, "Tanque Rye" and "Orey Kay," earned reputations for be-

Perhaps it hadn't been for Anderson (Andy) Anderson, Jerome's first mayor, the first Jerome county fair would not have been held back in 1926. A Jerome county fair had been in the thinking of many people early in the spring of 1926 but it wasn't until August that action was taken to go through with the event.

Before one step could be taken, however, the fair board had to find someone who could devote his time and efforts toward making the first county fair a success.

Who they contacted Mayor Andy Anderson, who was also chairman of the county commissioners; and, as always, he came through. Before any had passed plenty of activity about a fair.

The lot acres of ground had been obtained but in recalling those busy days 20 years ago, Jerome's first mayor said, "We had three weeks to clear the ground, build the large galvanized building, build a rodeo around the whole business. We were busy, busy and busy all the time we had to get our minds made up for the fair."

He couldn't be obtained, so I drove the county over and found young workers and hard ideas to keep the people having fun for the entire three days."

The first Jerome county fair was held Sept. 21, 22 and 23. The exhibits that couldn't be housed in the large building were displayed in tents.

More than 2,000 persons attended the fair the first day with 1,600 paid admission.

The fair featured ten departments including horses and ponies with Fred Huskey, superintendent; cattle with R. H. Calten, superintendent; and swine with E. W. Hestman, superintendent; sheep with J. W. Clelland, superintendent; poultry and hares with Geo. D. Pettit, superintendent; farm products with P. L. Dodd, superintendent; bees and honey with P. Hartman, superintendent; women's games under supervision of Jerome Civic club; floral with Mrs. W. C. White, superintendent; and junior farmers with Mrs. Flora M. Richardson, superintendent.

The 1950 fair board consisted of Keith Johnson, chairman; Virgil Gross, secretary; Tom Fran-

coaster; Leon Aslak, Glenn Churchman, Frank Horvath, Claude Bernard, Hamilton.

Seven departments are held in open competition and include, respectively: D. E. Modica, superintendent, directed by Virgil Galloway; attracted 12000; K. H. Kallala, superintendent; produce and community projects; Edna Loomer, superintendent; and Flowers, Mrs. L. W. Orin, superintendent. 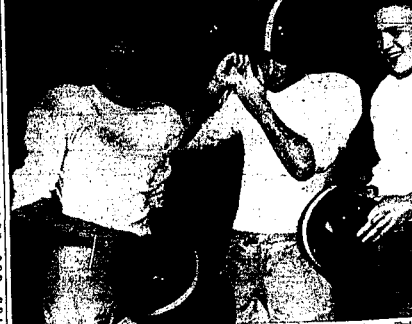
