PROMOTE OWN DESTRUCTION?

The nation's courts have always been prime guarantors of our democratic freedoms. And the rise of world-wide communism has put them to their strictest test in performing that protective job.

The basic question: How much freedom should a communist have to speak when he should be silent? How long should he be permitted to use of democracy's privileges to promote the destruction of democracy? At what point should he be stopped?

These issues were perfectly posed in last year's trial of the 11 so-called Smith act. The 11 were convicted of conspiring to teach and advocate the overthrow of this government by force and violence.

By the force of the conviction, men with their standard tactic of exploiting freedom in order to subvert it, appealed to the higher courts. For some time the courts have been guided by the rule that the promoting of subversion must be a clear and present danger.

Plainly such an outlook doesn't fit these days of global communism directed from Moscow. America's political party, in preserving the aims of Russia, rigidly disciplined to that purpose. The leaders' trial discloses specific programs of sabotage and revolutionary plots continued by party members under Soviet guidance.

"To wait until the eye of the carrying out of these plans has become a clear and present danger," this narrowly defined would be a mockery.

Fortunately the U. S. Supreme court recognized this. In its decision on this case, the court's opinion was clear and present danger even though war or revolution was not actually at hand when their subversive acts were committed in 1948.

And the judges sought to demolish the idea that a government can't move to protect itself. "It is not unconstitutional to prevent a clear and present danger," said the court, "one cannot teach and advocate the use of violence without necessarily intending to bring about its use."

By its ruling this court has admirably adapted established law to fit the perils of 1950. It has tried to make the law a living instrument capable of dealing with the communists' calculated warfare of freedom to their own ends. Such efforts preserve for the courts their vital role in American life.

Replacement Centers Open For Training

WASHINGTON, Aug. 17 (AP)—The army announced Wednesday the opening of 11 advanced replacement centers to speed the specialized training of soldiers.

The advanced centers, the army said, will be located at 10 existing army posts—two of the centers to be at Camp Gordon, Ga.

Basic training for all branches of the army and recruited military training will be carried on at replacement centers in continuity at the beginning of the Korean war or recaptured since then.

Specialized training will be conducted at the following posts: Anti-aircraft artillery at Fort Bliss, Tex.; artillery, Fort Bliss, Okla.; armor, Fort Knox, Ky.; chemical corps at the army chemical center, Edgewood Arsenal, Md.; engineers, Fort Belvoir, Va.; medical corps, Fort Belvoir, Md.; provost guard, quartermaster corps, Fort Lee, Va.; transportation corps, Fort Belvoir, Va.; signal and military police corps, Camp Gordon, Ga.

All these stations are now active army installations. The army said that the training activities will be added to their current operations.

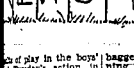

Senators Discuss New Proposal on Police for N. N.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 17 (AP)—A bipartisan Senate group Wednesday discussed a proposed resolution calling on President Truman to take the lead toward creation of a permanent military police force under the United Nations.

Senator Mundt, R., S. D., introduced the resolution would be introduced in the senate within a few days.

But Sen. Edwin C. Johnson, D. Colo., said he wasn't ready to go along with the idea now.

The U.N. police force would be armed and ready to go to any trouble spot in the world. It would be manned by volunteers from nations other than the United States, Britain, France, Russia and China.

The operations of the present U.N. force in Korea are limited to that country. It is made up chiefly of U. S. ground, naval and air units.

The plan was outlined by Rex Callerton, chairman of the Citizens Committee for United Nations Police, Inc., to 11 senators at a luncheon given at the Capitol by Senator Sparkman, D., Ala.

New Theory Advanced on Polio Cause

WASHINGTON, Aug. 11 (AP)—A Washington doctor has advanced the theory that you have to have some kind of a wound in order to get infantile paralysis.

Dr. James O. Cummings, the lecturer of children's venereal diseases, said that during summer-time when they have full freedom of play—may account for the fact that polio is more prevalent during the summer months.

He believes direct damage to nerve tissue is necessary to allow the polio virus to invade the nervous system and produce disease.

Dr. Cummings said natural wounds like the cavities of baby teeth could produce such damage.

He also said tonsillitis and other surgical operations as well as accidental wounds could disrupt these nerve fibers and lay the nerve system open to attack.

Dr. Cummings' theory that the virus of polio is transmitted from person to person by direct or indirect contact—and then develops on the linings of the mouth, throat and intestinal tract.
