U. S. Troops Are Troubled By 'Refugees'

By JACK JAMES

ON THE SOOTHWESTERN FRONT IN KOREA, the U. S. troops are being troubled by a new type of "refugee" who while he fights the red troops...

What do you do when they, women and children in native white drudge by you with their pathetic bundles and try remember that yesterday one such "refugee" turned around and shot at you from the back?

Slipping guerrillas through American lines, disguised as refugees, with uniforms and weapons in their bundles—is a favorite North Korean trick.

Perplexing Problem "The whole problem of dealing with the civilian population is one of the most perplexing the American command in Korea has had to solve."

"If they aren't rough, a lot more of us get wounded and killed."

"Capt. C. R. Walton, Newburyport, Mass., tells a typical story."

During heavy morning action in last week's American advance, the residents of two villages fled to the hills.

The front moved on beyond the villages and Walton, of the 26th division's 100th field artillery, was setting up a supporting battery when the civilians returned.

Many were men. Many had packs on their backs which could have hidden automatic weapons, ammunition or light mortars.

Walton didn't have enough men to send patrols into the villages and check every house.

"And they were swarming all over the hills," he said.

Next morning sniper fire fell into the battery's positions.

"The communists operate individually as snipers once they get the hold American line, or they assemble into an efficient mobile harassing force."

From a reconnaissance plane Col. Henry G. Fisher, 35th regimental combat team commander, saw "a man changing from white clothes to uniforms in a small valley."
