Survey Tells Activities for School Pupils

More than 90 per cent of the students at Twin Falls high school are active in extra-curricular activities, according to John D. Welhausen, director of the local high school activities program. The results of a recent survey were as follows:

Of the 1,000 students in the Twin Falls high school, 900 are active in one or more of the following activities: 400 in sports, 300 in clubs, 200 in organizations, 100 in volunteer work, and 100 in other activities. More than 500 students are active in two or more activities. More than 200 students are active in three or more activities. More than 100 students are active in four or more activities. More than 50 students are active in five or more activities.

Other findings: 80 per cent of the students do not take any extra-curricular activities. 20 per cent of the students are active in one or more activities. 40 per cent of the students are active in two or more activities. 30 per cent of the students are active in three or more activities. 10 per cent of the students are active in four or more activities. 5 per cent of the students are active in five or more activities.

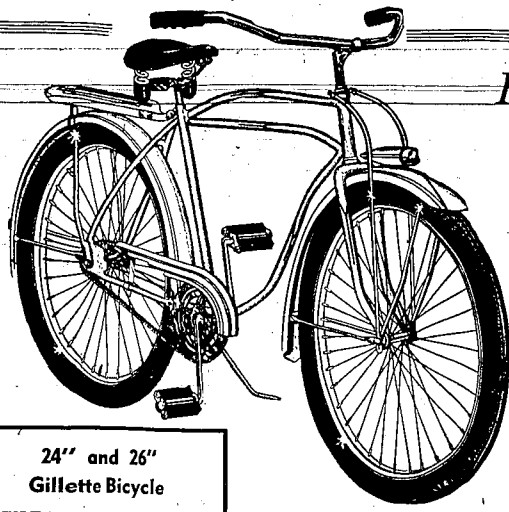

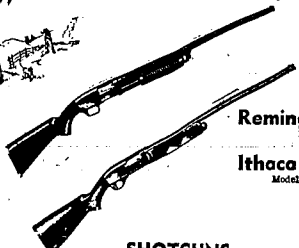

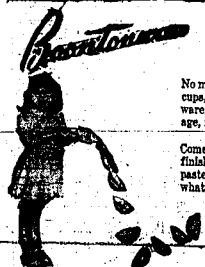

Army Chief's Visit Results In Close Call

TOKYO, Aug. 24 (AP)—Gen. J. Lawton Collins, U. S. army chief of staff, escaped close with death on a flying visit to Korean warfronts Wednesday, but came back optimistic.

He missed a raking of red Korean roadblock fire by 15 minutes near Taegu. On his return to Tokyo Collins said: "Things are coming along very well over there."

He said he was well pleased with morale among all American and South Korean forces.

Collins also visited a South Korean front line division.

Fly to Korea

Collins and Adm. Forrest P. Sherman, U. S. chief of naval operations, flew to Korea in separate planes. They were met by Lieut. Gen. Walton H. Walker, commander of the U. S. eighth army.

Walker and Collins together visited an advanced command post of the U. S. 27th regiment north of Taegu. They went within a mile of America's most forward positions.

Road Blocked

About 15 minutes after they left the command post, the road their 12-ship convoy traveled came under fire of infiltrating tanks.

Four American officers were killed.

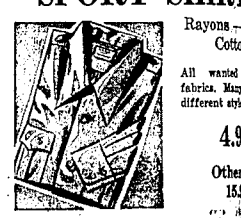

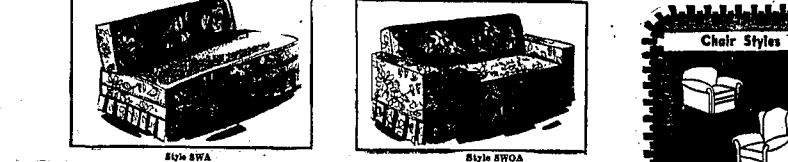

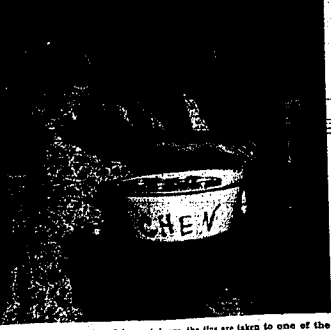

SAN FRANCISCO (NPA)—Maternity care is taking a step back to grandmother's day, when babies were born at home and shared life with mother almost from birth.

The difference is that the hospital is replacing the home with "rooming-in" units, in which mother and child share the same quarters throughout the confinement period after the first 24 hours.

This return to old-fashioned maternity actually represents one of the newest practices in obstetrical care and is beginning to gain acceptance across the nation. It is typified at Franklin hospital in San Francisco, where the fifth "rooming-in" unit in the U. S. is just opened, is attracting the interest of many other great hospitals.

Far more scientific than home births, the new unit is a streamlined ward decorated in pink and blue and partitions off into individual nurseries, a nurse at her desk in the center of the ward is able to observe each mother and child at all times.

In keeping with the "natural approach" babies are fed on demand rather than according to an arbitrary schedule; many doctors now concede there is strong relationship between natural feeding and an infant's emotional development.

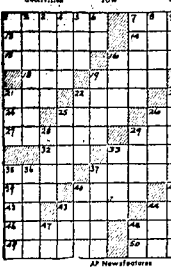

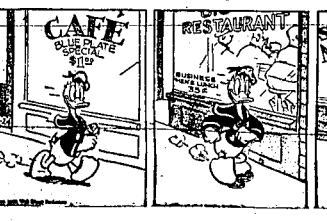

GIs in Korea Cheer Army's Training Plan

TORNO, Aug. 24 (AP)—Show them how to belly down under machine-gun fire. Teach them how to knock out a foot mortar crew on the side. Tell them that when they are told to attack there is no "no way-out" that way.

That's the way the GIs on the Korean battlefield greeted the news that the army was dropping the "new" aspect of its basic training program.

The army is dropping the official reason for its decision to train recruits to fighting men instead of to peacetime soldiers. This is probably that lesson learned in the early days of the Korean fighting were responsible.

No Public Remarks

U. S. field officers refuse to say anything public about the problems created by the "career guidance program" of the peacetime army.

Off the record, however, they'll tell you of the lack of discipline in many instances and the death of non-coms with leadership qualities.

The GIs who have been under fire realize too that it's more important to be "warmed up" at some training camp in the states than it is on the battlefield "with their guns shooting red bullets."

The soldiers still think the career guidance program has its points, but generally they object to being non-commissioned trainees on a man's ability to play the piccolo or operate a radar set.

Tough Non-Coms Needed

They realize that non-coms are the backbone of a fighting force and ratings from corporal to top sergeant should be held by men who can give orders and have them obeyed without hesitation.

Officers in particular have complained about discipline under fire and mentioned the notorious "stragglers" in the early days of the fighting.

Stragglers exist in every war, but some field officers believe there were more than there should have been. They blamed it on the soft life of occupation in Japan and the lack of rigid discipline under the "panto waist" scheme of the "peacetime army."

Answers U. S. Steel Prayers

'Iron Mountain' in Venezuela Easing U. S. Steel Ore Dearth

PITTSBURGH (AP)—Christians in 1946 was a little unusual for G. M. Miron, vice president of U. S. Steel. He spent part of the day listening to two young geologists tell him who he should play Santa Claus with \$185,000 of his company's money.

Though hundreds of thousands had already been paid out fruitlessly on the same gamble, Miron told the two to go ahead. With a third geologist borrowed from a rival firm, they were the remnants of a small band of men who had been methodically ransacking the globe for a year. Their goal: A great new source of iron.

The search was almost desperate. The high-grade ores of the great Mesabi range in Minnesota, for decades the nation's chief source, were being pined out in 20 years. A big new strike on the Quebec-Labrador border would help some producers, but not big steel. Sizing it in the face was the prospect of spending billions to turn out usable ores from the vast fields of low-grade, iron-bearing taconite rock in Minnesota.

The world had been combed repeatedly for rich deposits in U. S. Steel files were fat with geologists' pessimistic reports. But early in 1946 it decided to have "just one more look around" before plunging deeply into taconite.

That last look was something. Hundreds of properties were examined in rich scattered spots at Alaska, British Columbia, Newfoundland, Mediterranean and west

coast Africa, Puerto Rico, Cuba, Mexico, Central America, Brazil and Venezuela.

Geologists took to the air to spot likely-looking areas. Some plotted overland to study prospects at close hand. Roads were built and machinery hauled by crude transport to key places. A great deal of iron was found, but none in huge masses.

By Christmas of 1948 Miron's two visitors and their borrowed assistant were among the few still eager for the hunt. Facing Miron's hopeful Christmas gift the trio headed back to Venezuela for a last bold try. Carefully they photographed 2,500 square miles of unexplored land in eastern Venezuela. They became interested in two small mountains, and mined in for a good look. One April morning at 2,000-foot summit of one of the pair, now called Cerro Bolivar. From 2:30 until 4:30 in the afternoon they walked the mountain top. They were astounded. Cerro Bolivar was almost pure iron in apparently unbelievable amounts.

Quickly and quietly, all available diamond drills were rushed from other test areas and hasty. Nearly 200 holes were drilled, and specimens were blasted to check-check the findings.

Scientists blinked as magnetometers, measuring iron content, gave the highest readings ever recorded—an average of 63 per cent.

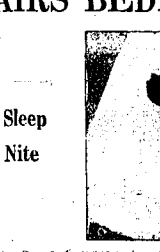

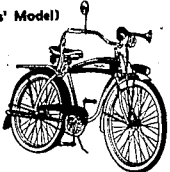

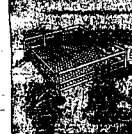
