

## Final Armistice Talks Move Made To Hold Off Strike Plans

WASHINGTON, Aug. 25 (AP)—President Truman today ordered seizure of the nation's railroads at 2 p. m. (MST) Sunday.

Acting because of the nationwide strike called for Monday by two railroad unions, Mr. Truman directed that Secretary of the Army Paul H. Nitze and operate the roads "in the name of the United States government."

In a statement, Mr. Truman also called upon "every railroad worker to cooperate with the government by remaining on duty."

The unions have said they would work under government seizure. In fact, they have urged several times the government to give the railroads because of their 18-month-old wage-hike dispute.

**ANOTHER IDAHO POWER PLANT**

Those people in southern Idaho who want no part of a Columbia valley authority—judging from the recent published statistics that the state will welcome the company to construct another generating unit on Snake river near Mountain Home—may be disappointed. The power company has been made one of the chief targets of the CVA enthusiasts in their thirst for more government control over our water resources.

While other less courageous privately owned utilities have folded up under all the federal pressure, the Idaho Power Company has refused to bend to them, but has kept pace with public demand as well. Its service has been excellent, its rates have been reasonable, and its relationships with the public have been good.

All that stands out as a challenge to the CVA's misrepresentations. They would have us believe that the Columbia valley authority of electrical energy falls far short of its territory's needs. Some of the CVA spellbinders have even gone so far as to claim that the Idaho power company as standing in the way of Idaho's progress because "it has no additional power to offer potential industries."

All such trips as this are applied to the best interests of the New York state, greatest newspaper in the United States and long recognized for its fairness and accuracy.

"Idaho is keeping abreast of the demand for electricity and negotiations between the Idaho Power company and potential new customers," said a correspondent for the Times.

The utility last year added more power than its capacity totaled at the end of the first quarter of its existence. In three and a half years it has practically tripled its supply of electricity for the state.

"It is in contrast to the situation in the Northwest's coastal states, where most of the building of hydroelectric plants in the post-war period has been in government."

"So in more ways than one, it's good news that the Idaho Power company now plans to add another \$150,000,000 worth of capacity to its plant. It follows—largely of the six plants constructed by the company since 1946.

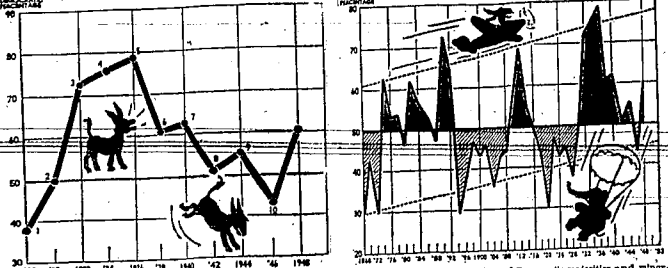

### Seasonal Dips Trim Price of Food at Retail

WASHINGTON, Aug. 23 (AP)—Sharp seasonal drops in some fresh vegetable and fruit prices produced a statistical decline of about three cents and one per cent in retail food prices in the first half of August, the government said today.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics revealed that retail prices for a basket of 25 foods in 13 large cities, it estimated, was the same trend for 54 large cities.

While harvest season price drops were being recorded for some vegetables, notably tomatoes, most meat prices were going up, and such articles as diet items as butter, eggs and coffee rose about one per cent.
