TOKYO, (Thursday), Aug. 31 (AP)—The Korean war front blazed with action Wednesday as allied forces lashed back at mounting North Korean forward probing forays for a breakthrough. **GEN. MACARTHUR'S WARNING**

President Truman to our way of thinking, has pulled a lot of bones since he became the nation's chief executive. But he made one of his biggest mistakes in not attending to the duties of the office of the President.

Far be it to the Times-News to defend everything about this country's military setup, in any respect. It is a heavy, well-equipped, and costly apparatus, with various departments fighting among themselves. But that does not detract for a moment from the outstanding job done in the Pacific. He and General Eisenhower are the two military figures in whom the people of this country have a world of confidence.

Not only have the secretaries of both state and defense been up to their bungles and short-sightedness, but the President, in his usual slave-to-politics manner, has defended them personally instead of in the name of the short-sighted policy makers.

With all this uncertainty in Washington, the President has chosen to crack down on the man best qualified to tell us what we may expect in the future. This is General MacArthur, mindful of conditions in Washington, thought it was for the country's own good that he should send a special message of condolence and fraternal encouragement to the Veterans of Foreign Wars, it's for the people themselves to judge whether or not he was out of order. But in MacArthur's designation of the people already mentioned, it still remains for the people to decide on whom they are placing the most trust.

It is reminding the people that Formosa is a key spot which, if held by the enemy, "could be compared to an unsinkable aircraft carrier and submarine tender identity located." the general was probably telling us something we should know, even though it conflicts with administration policies.

It's an unusual procedure to be sure for such an organization of special deputies to be recruited from among the general citizenry in an attempt to enforce the law. But the conditions are such that a more effective traffic violations agency which seems to defy all solution.

The Twin Falls Traffic Safety council may expect some criticism for engaging in the task of law enforcement. But the opposition no doubt will come from those who refuse to become seriously alarmed about the hazards on our highways.

All those with a real respect for law and order and certainly all those who have had loved ones killed and crippled by thoughtless drivers will commend the Twin Falls Traffic Safety council, its special deputies and the law enforcement authorities for their combined efforts to cope with an almost hopeless problem.
