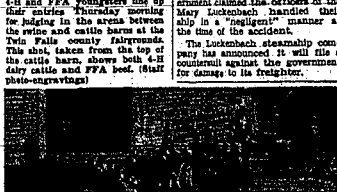

They were met by a large crowd of people. Some were holding signs and shouting slogans. The atmosphere was tense and chaotic. The envoys tried to move through the crowd, but they were repeatedly blocked. The demonstration continued for several hours. The envoys eventually left the city. The situation in Korea remains uncertain. The American intervention has been highly criticized. Many people believe that the United States is interfering in the internal affairs of another country. The Korean people are suffering from the conflict. They are tired of the fighting and the destruction. They want peace and stability. The American envoys' visit is seen as a provocation. It is a sign of American aggression. The Korean people will continue to resist the American intervention. They will fight for their freedom and their country.

**Only 50 Lost GIs Listed as Korean PWs**  
WASHINGTON, Aug. 31 (AP)—With the exception of 50 officially identified prisoners of war, the American soldiers captured by the North Koreans are still just "missing in action" on official army lists. It is safe assumption that of the approximately 2,500 thus far officially listed as missing in action, a good number are now in North Korean concentration camps. The army, however, will have no way of knowing until the communists come forth with a complete list, or allow a neutral observer, such as the International Red Cross, to inspect the camps. An army officer said that according to the best of our knowledge at this time the American PWs are being held in camps in northern Korea. This information was obtained from North Korean broadcast and underground and unofficial source. The only official word from the North Koreans on American PWs was a list of 50 names sent through the International Red Cross in Geneva. The list was received by the state department on Aug. 23 and relayed on to the army. The list

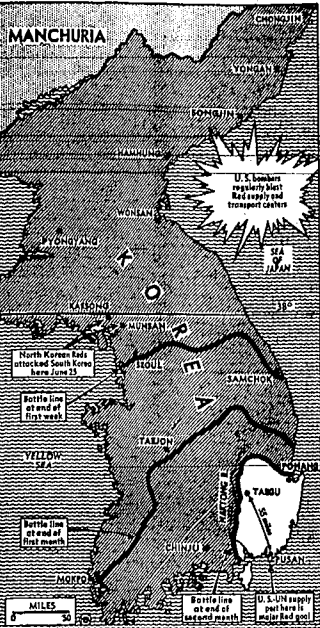

### U. S. Plan on Korea Takes New Tangent

WASHINGTON, Aug. 31 (AP)—The question of whether the United States intends to carry the war on into communist North Korea has developed a new and interesting facet. From an American point of view, the military strategy branch of the Defense Department is now concerned with the possibility of a broad front attack on the communist forces that their communist rulers will be ousted as the 38th parallel division line crated.

In Haid Warnings The suggestion is conveyed in an air raid warning leaflet being dropped in North Korea. It advises civilians to move away from the cities which have been converted into military targets by your communist leaders.

And it tells them they should join others who have left the cities so that "you can help build a strong, free Korea, after the communists have been driven out."

Conceding that this is a psychological maneuver, it still is noteworthy that a United States agency has suggested to a Russian satellite that its communist government will be ousted out. A "free" Korea would mean that the artificial boundary between north and south would be wiped out.

Strong Medicine This would be strong medicine for Moscow to take.

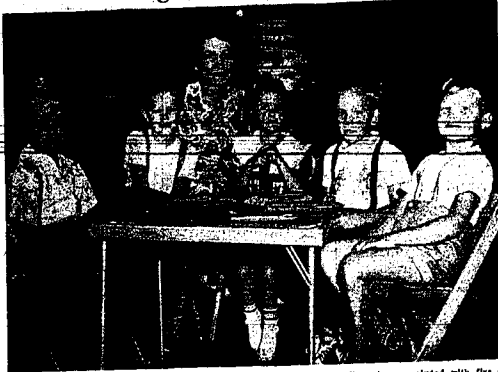
The Russian created the North Korean satellite state, using as a pretext a situation which it allies accepted the surrender of the Japanese armies.

As explained by Secretary of State Acheson, the 38th parallel was "imposed" to be purely a military line for the purpose of accepting the surrender of the Japanese by American forces south of the parallel and Russian forces north of the parallel.

Yesterday Acheson told his new audience a decision on going past the 38th parallel is up to the United Nations.

### Indians Seek End of Movie 'Villain' Role

BELLINGHAM, Wash., Aug. 31 (AP)—America's Indians are tired of having their ancestors portrayed as "villains" in movies and school books.

The National Congress of American Indians has passed a resolution against "movie-mania" and "picture-making" in "villain" roles.

John L. Jefferson, chairman of the governing executive council on Indian affairs, urged that school history books be rewritten to present the Indian in a more favorable light.

Jefferson also advocated that government call meetings to discuss statement of conditions under which Indians live in their states and to promote cooperation between whites and tribesmen.

Justice N. H. Johnson of the supreme court told the convention that after more than 100 years of government supervision, the Indian still presents one of the nation's most pressing social and economic problems. He is president of the Indian congress.

It is a sad part of the trouble to develop effective leadership, forced migration and isolation have resulted from the government's failures in the past in its dealings with Indians. Extreme paternalism, he said, has only aggravated the problem.

"What the American Indian wants," he declared, "is to be just an American citizen like all other Americans, and to accept the responsibilities of citizenship along with the privileges."

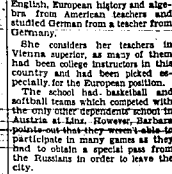

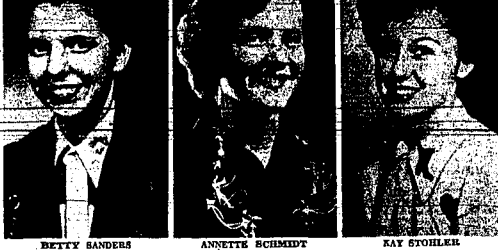

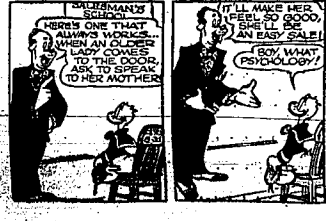

TONGYONG, Korea, Aug. 31 (AP)—Meet the enemy. Meet the REAL enemy.

Meet Hak Un Lee, 22, base agent and brags about his work in the South. He was captured near this South Korean town in the month of August, 1945.

He was questioned by Dr. Lewis, a pathologist and interpreter from Richmond, Va.

He is said to be a peasant of Minerva youth handed a gun and forced to fight in the front lines. He is a rabid communist, thoroughly indoctrinated.

**Discusses Philosophy**  
Calmly puffing an American cigarette, he discusses communist philosophy. He has learned since he joined the Korean Young Peoples Association four years ago.

"This fight for unification of Korea to come of your business," he said defiantly. "Why are you butting in?"

When Dr. Bong told him the U. S. was here to defend Korean democracy, Lee laughed bitterly and shook his head in disbelief.

During the interrogation, the prisoner admitted the North Koreans were the invaders.

Called for "Maneuvers"  
"They told us the south had attacked us but we didn't believe it," he said. "We were called up during the maneuvers and moved to the border on the 25th for 'maneuvers' but we knew it was to fight."

He said his only regrets were that "we should have waited until we were better prepared—we didn't have enough training."

One of the amazing things about this prisoner is that he doesn't think the North Koreans have a chance.

**Part of 'System'**  
"I knew it at Seoul when we first fought the Americans," Lee said. "But it's part of the system and if we stopped we would have been killed. We had to fight."

The system he referred to was world domination by the communists.

The Russians have been our friends and have done many great things for Korea," Lee said. "They improved our roads and railroads and gave us security and honest government."

And the Americans—you have made the United Nations your slave and they have to fight for you."

# Ingenuity Blocks Newsprints' Lack For U. S. Papers

NEW YORK, Aug. 31 (AP)—By ingenuity and exercising ingenuity, United States newspapers and Canadian mills are meeting a newsprint crisis better than had been expected.

Four-fifths of this country's supply of newsprint, the paper on which newspapers are printed, comes from Canada and three-fourths of that comes by rail. It had been feared the Canadian rail strike now in its 15th day would result in an early and severe shortage of supplies in this country, and cause Canadian mills to shut down.

But Cranston Williams, general manager of the American Newspaper Publishers association, said he did not believe the newsprint situation had reached a critical stage for many papers yet.

He told the Associated Press that newsprint mills have remained open and "have been making superhuman efforts to keep production going."

Williams said both newspapers and the U. S. mills are taking unusual steps to meet the situation.
