## Area Turkey Crop Holding Par With '49

WENDELL, Sept. 2.—This fall's turkey crop may be about the same as in other sections of Idaho, according to a U. S. department of agriculture report, but it will be about the same here.

The USDA reports the state's 1950 crop is estimated at 240,000, or 55 per cent of the 1949 crop of 440,000 birds. Even with the 5 per cent drop, the state's total will be higher than any year since 1945, when 368,000 were produced—except for 1949.

The 10-year average is 272,000 for the 1937-46 period, the USDA report stated.

### Complete Plant

Most of the employment upswing was attributed to factory hiring.

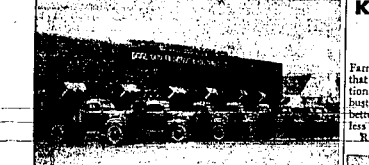

# County Assessed Valuation Climbs

A gain of \$32,728 in the assessed valuation of public utilities in Twin Falls county was reported in a statement received from the state commission by the county auditor.

The gain raised the total county assessed valuation, excluding migratory animals, from \$42,212,468 for 1949 to \$74,941,897 for 1950.

The raise resulted primarily from increased assessments on telegraph poles which jumped from \$3,671,288 in 1949 to \$4,126,956 in 1950. A new addition to the public utility roll was the classification for pipelines which added \$8,270.

The valuations for other utilities were nearly the same as for 1949. They are railroads, \$2,731,810; telephone lines, \$76,245; telegraph lines, \$65,659, and car companies, \$25,670.

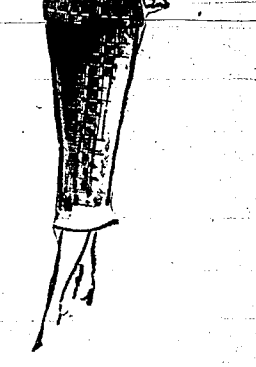

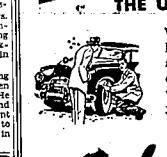
