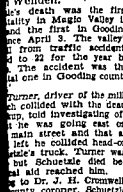

Indian Youths Get Rehearing In Theft Case

MOSCOW, Sept. 7 (AP)—Four Indian youths who were sentenced last fall to 10 to 14 years on a charge of stealing a sheep will have a chance to change their plea here this month.

The four are Aloysius and Avery Whitlock and Elmer Beckman, all of Tropic, Ida., and William Lawrence, Lapwai, Ida. They were sentenced under A. J. Maloney's decision at Moscow last June.

In the state penitentiary, but did not serve any of the sentence pending an appeal to the state supreme court. The high court failed to uphold the district court sentence on grounds the Indian youths were not provided with counsel.

Their retrial was scheduled Wednesday for Sept. 13 in Judge Morgan's court, according to Murray Estes, Moscow, their attorney.

The supreme court appeal was filed by Felix Cohen, New York, an attorney for the Association of American Indian Affairs, Inc., which took an active interest in the case.

Cohen maintained in his brief that the four Indians had pleaded guilty because they had been told the judge would be lenient and that there was little for them to worry about. Cohen also said that the accused were not informed of their rights to counsel and were thus deprived of their freedom without due process of law.

The four were arrested on the sheep theft charge last October and the supreme court ruling was handed down last June.

Truman Blast About Marine Corps Eased

President Truman has moved to appease the wrath which descended upon him because his references to the U. S. marines as "the navy's propoganda machine" that is almost equal to Stalin's.

The President made his statements in reply to a letter from a Republican congressman who was seeking marine representation on the joint chiefs of staff. No one has as yet defended either the words or the President's action in uttering them, beyond pointing out that he may have slipped into ill-considered shortness of temper because of the pressure under which he has been working lately.

"Propaganda" Line
It was possible to read as much meanness as you wish into his statements, or to consider them poor vehicles for the point the President was trying to make—that the marines are no to be magnified out of "what he considers" the proper vehicle line.

Truman is too smart a politician to launch a deliberate attack on something so central to the public itself has reacted to the marine record by becoming a part of the corps' propoganda machine.

Transcend Purpose
It is a corps which can retort truthfully that its heavy artillery and its battles in Korea and the Arzons were no police actions, and that the matter of conducting such land operations on a national scale is a matter of a naval campaign. That is the primary assigned purpose of the corps under the law.

The President could hardly have intended to mean that the marine propoganda machine consisted with immoral intent. He must have been thinking about integrity, solicitude, and the bitter fight for the preservation of marine identity during the development of the armed forces unification program.

Truly Professional Force
The marines are few in peace, thus their numbers have never been so drastically reduced, on a percentage basis, as those of the army and navy, and in wartime they have never been so greatly multiplied. Therefore, when troubles come, they are more ready, and throughout out a war they attract the glamour of a David. They also represent about the only truly professional armed force, insofar as that refers to the proportion of the ranks who make the corps their life business.

Truman said the words, and men who die tomorrow, in the tradition of a corps in which they have taken what is to some of them more than a bodily hurt. Mr. Truman obviously regrets that, but does not retreat from his stand on the corps' position.

Municipal Band in Twin Falls Proud of State Record in Length of Its Service

Only a handful of those who heard the Twin Falls municipal band at the Twin Falls county rodeo were located in the valley when the band gave its first concert in 1902. But most of those outsiders, both in the band and out, agreed that the 1902 band was the best in its 46-year history.

Not only has the band improved in quality but it has increased considerably in size from the original 16 members, organized by C. D. Thomas, George Lay and Will Camp. Dr. Orin A. Fuller, present director, has been with the organization since 1911 when he was a "boy wonder" conductor. He entered the band as a high school student despite prejudice against utilizing student musicians.

Since then he has outgrown his student status and is considered by most the best director the band has ever had. He took over directing the band since he entered except during a period of military duty during World War I.

At first the municipal band was financed entirely by contributions from Twin Falls merchants, who gave generously but who could not finance the organization in the style to which it wished to become accustomed.

But after approximately 20 years of such financial hardship, the state passed a law making it possible for the city to hold a bond issue and vote a mill tax. Income from this tax, passed in 1926, averaged approximately \$7,000.

Three funds pay for the 12 summer concerts, uniforms, equipment and music. This levy and the persistent interest of both band members and audiences have kept the band in continuous operation. No other band in the state has operated continuously for so long a period. In most locations, 1902's band is approximately three or four years.

And few other Idaho bands, if any, give as many concerts during the summer season. And when the old-timers get together, reminiscing brings out many colorful incidents in the band's history.

They remember both the wars. Every band member leaving for the "war to end all wars" was marched to the train station by the diminishing units. During the second war, the band would be at the bus depot early in the morning to accompany departing draftees and enlistees.

Others will laugh as they recall the night they gave a concert in downtown Twin Falls. The band was preparing to practice on the back of a hayrack until the hayrack collapsed under them.

There was the trip to Wells in the 1920's (or was it the 1910's). The band traveled by car—all but most of the way. One of the vehicles broke down six miles north of the Nevada town and driver and passengers walked the rest of the way.

Then, in 1943, Jack Thorpe published a list of his selections for an all-time "all-star" band. Others had different ideas on the subject and the affair resulted in tongue-slashing and injured feelings. Thorpe, undaunted by the disagreement with his choices, said he thought he'd try it again sometime to include more recent members.

Band members themselves built the first concert stand in the park. It was replaced with the present structure—built by the OVA—for \$75,000.
