WHY WE OWN FORMOSA?

All kinds of people have been hearing America for months to get up on her haunches and holler back at Russia. We've been doing more of it lately, but far from enough.

Formosa is a good example. Russia and red China dream that we're invading Chinese territory by having our seventh fleet patrol the waters between the island and the mainland.

As you say we're invading, but we allow the most important fact in the whole situation to get buried under a lot of confusing blather. The fact is this:

Under international law Formosa doesn't belong to China at all—either to the communist government or to Chiang Kai-shek.

In 1895, after the Sino-Japanese war, Formosa was ceded by a defeated China to Japan, which held it continuously until the end of World War II.

From the moment Japan's surrender, Formosa became conquered enemy territory. Since it had been formally yielded by China, in 1895 treaty, it did not automatically revert to the United States by force of arms.

The final status of conquered enemy soil is settled only in peace treaties or by general international agreements.

There's one complication. In wartime conferences at Cairo and Yalta, the U. S. promised Chiang Kai-shek he could have Formosa back when Japan was licked.

How Formosa shall be disposed of ultimately is something else. It's a question that Russia and red China make a fair peace treaty settlement impossible.
