### \$425,885 Set As Minidoka School Fund

RUPERT, Sept. 9.—A budget of \$425,885 and a tax of 2.21 mills has been approved by trustees for Minidoka high school class A school district No. 311.

Don Dufoe, county superintendent, said today the budget and tax were adopted at a meeting of the board last Wednesday night. The budget represents a slight increase over last year's expenditures of \$422,000.

Of the total budget, \$278,200 is earmarked for instructional purposes, compared to \$269,147 for the 1949-50 school year.

Two factors were cited as causing the deficit: (1) operations of some small units which could be combined with some larger units and (2) the board is faced with the problem of having to provide space and equipment for higher enrollment through capital outlays from high school operations.

Enrollment totals for the second week of school were 1,457 in all schools for grades 1 through 6, 407 in high school and 899 high school students. The grand total for the district is 2,863. Dufoe said.

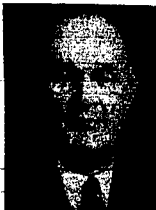

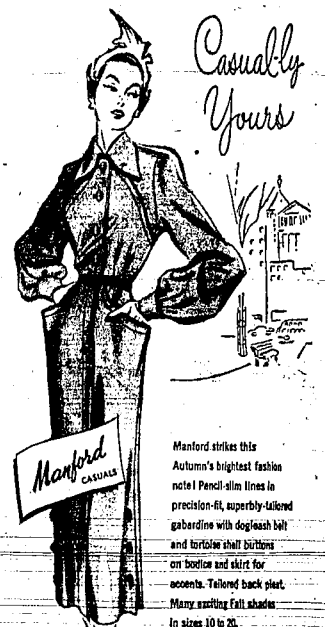

# Life in MAGIC VALLEY

One of the things that makes life in Magic Valley so interesting is that much of its history was only yesterday. This, of course, is true in no sense no matter where a person lives. Today's have a habit of becoming yesterday's men here as those who, in most places, would be selected to the printed page. Once Magic Valley emerged from the "frontier" within its circled boundaries, its history still is walking around in the memory of the old-timers who lived at mid-winter at the birth of the valley.

Today's paved streets, electric lights, running water and automobiles are commonplace to the valley. There are no more "frontier" days here—waded across the mud at Shoshone and Main in TWIN FALLS. There are those who remember when living next to a spring was the living in the lap of luxury.

Some of them are your neighbors. Your friends, even your relatives. Take F. Rutledge, a former resident of MURTAUGH, for example. Rutledge, now living with his daughter, Mrs. J. V. Gearty, Twin Falls, never did anything especially spectacular in the valley but he is one of the many persons living in the valley today who helped to make what it is.

Rutledge, now 80 years old, was born in Iowa on a cattle and horse ranch. In his youth he accompanied his father on his cattle and horse ranches in Iowa and Illinois. He attended school in Chicago and was a student of the father of former Vice President Henry Wallace. As a matter of fact, Rutledge "knew" the future president on more than one occasion when Mr. and Mrs. Wallace were away.

Rutledge first came to Idaho in 1893 to open and operate an experimental station at Nampa. While at the station he purchased a large team of horses and then sold them to a freighter. The freighter, in the meantime, had suddenly and Rutledge had to take over the freight business. Rutledge knows and appreciates the automobile and the truck. He also knows what it means to blacken a span of eight hours over roads that were no more than trails.

Rutledge apparently had a short run in a clothing store for a brief time in Boise "went-trip" and had a brief undertaking. While living in Boise he helped form the first company of the original "Lumber" which was organized in 1902. While living in Boise, Rutledge met Bill Housen and Tom Rabbit and, with them, made the first survey for the Minkoma dam on the Snake river. Plans for the dam were drawn and then the three men surveyed lands for the proposed canal. The Spanish-American war interrupted the work and Rutledge then held a captain's commission in the service. When the war was over he returned to Idaho but stayed there only a short time, then he was back in Idaho, this time stopping at HEYBURN where he met and married the late Anna MacFarlane in 1902. The couple homesteaded at ARRESTAN CITY, before moving to their ranch, where they lived for four years in HEYBURN. While living there Rutledge became the town's first assessor.

Later Rutledge sold his ranch and purchased some dry land south of HEYBURN, some of which he still owns. Ever since his work on Minkoma dam, however, he has been a proponent of irrigation and always hopes to see all land in the valley under irrigation. When Rutledge left his homestead in 1919, he moved to MURTAUGH and engaged in a real estate business with W. C. Hall. He retired a number of years ago.

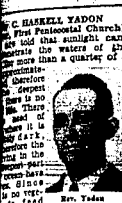

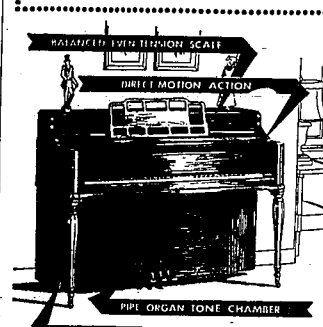

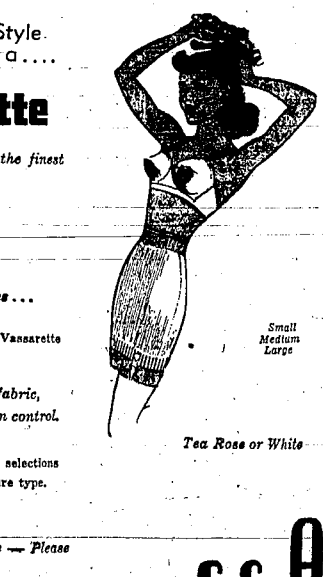
