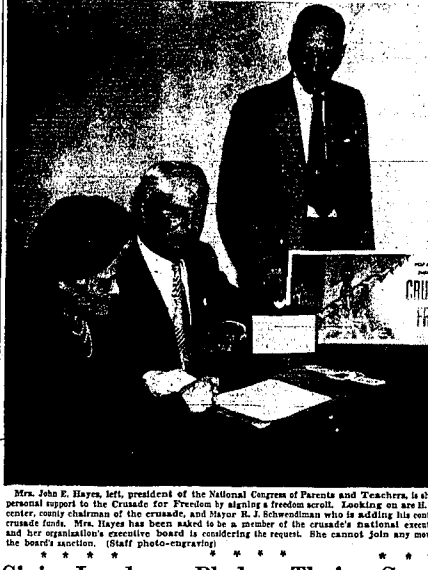

### Birth Decline In '44 Shows Up in School

Reflecting a decline in Twin Falls births in 1944, there is a decrease of 26 first grade students in Twin Falls district schools this year, Supt. A. W. Morgan reported to the board of directors Monday night. Clyde Koonis, outgoing chairman of the board, pointed out that there was another decline in 1943 births indicating another drop in the number of first graders can be expected next year. However, the number of firsts after 1943 increased abruptly with a peak in 1947. If the birth rate is reflected in school enrollment, a peak number of first graders can be expected in 1953 and 1954. Superintendent Morgan pointed out that a portion of the decline in first grade registrations this year can be attributed to a state ruling which specifies a child must be at least six months old to start school. The age deadline previously was six weeks later. Registration figures show enrollment in Twin Falls district schools has increased from 2,697 in 1943 to 3,943 this year. Total enrollment last year was 3,772.
