

## Senate Approves Panel Won't Check Idaho Guns

WASHINGTON, Sept. 15 (AP)—The senate will make no investigation of the Idaho primary election, a subcommittee was ruled today.

After a review of alleged irregularities in counting ballots was made by Senator Glen H. Taylor, R-Ide., who defeated by less than 1,000 votes in his bid for reelection nomination for a second term. Former Sen. Clark won the nomination.

House subcommittee members sent investigators to Idaho and, on the basis of their report, declined to order a recount of the ballots.

In a statement today, the committee said:

"There was clear evidence of divers irregularities in the balloting and also evidence that there was considerable fraud in some of the ballots under Idaho laws and regulations, but the committee is unable to determine whether there was no evidence of fraud, collusion or willful breach of the election laws. The committee added:

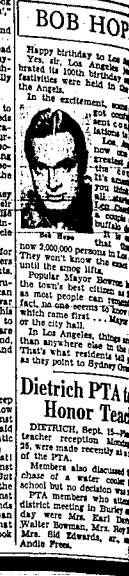

U. N. Agency Had Warning Of Red Plans

LAKE BOZEMAN, Sept. 15 (AP)—The United Nations Korean commission disclosed today that South Korea intelligence checked and reported that a communist attack was imminent but that it would be repulsed.

The disclosure was made in the 11th annual report of the seven-member commission to the general assembly.

The report blamed the North Korean "aggression" on the conflict and described the June 25 attack as an act of long-premeditated and unprovoked aggression.

Replying to Russian charges that it was the South Koreans who first advanced the 28th parallel, the report said:

"The commission is unambiguously of the opinion that no offensive could possibly have been launched across the parallel by the Republic of Korea."

Act of Aggression "The invasion of the territory of the Republic of Korea by the armed forces of North Korean military units was an act of aggression, in that it was the South Koreans who first advanced the 28th parallel, the report said."

The disparity between the views of the U. N. and South Korean military intelligence dated back as far as last January, the report indicated.

It added, however, that Brig. Gen. Curtis Lemie, chief of staff of the U. N. military advisory group, disagreed with these estimates.
