GOODING, Sept. 16—The board of trustees of school district 231 has approved the budget for 1950-51. Due to an increase in valuation of property in Gooding school district from \$1,052,220 to \$1,024,426, the mill levy was decreased three mills on the bond interest fund.

The total levy is now 22 1/2 mills as compared with 27 mills last year; one and one-half mill reduction was announced last spring.

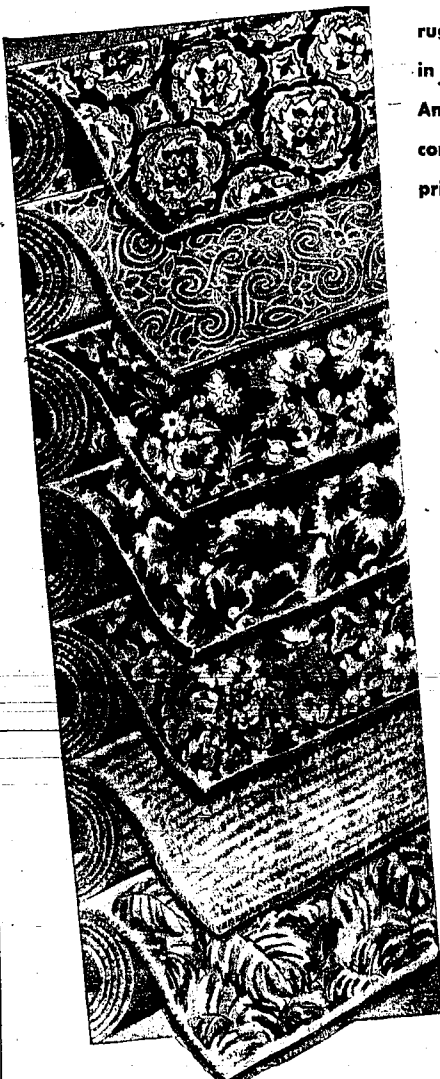

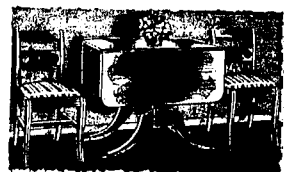

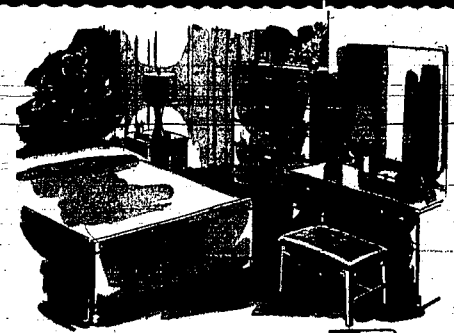

225-Mile View

The Aug. 11 fireball was seen by some from a distance of 225 miles. The time of appearance, direction traveled and its breaking into three pieces positively identified it. Many observers in three states were sure "it fell near them."

Spreads Also Confuse

Heights and speeds are also confusing. "About 2200 feet high," "Disintegrated 100 feet above the ground," "Going 100 miles per hour."

Most Observers of Fireballs are Quizzed by the "What?"

A hotel operator wrote, "My wife and I were awed and filled with amazement. It was a beautiful view of a celestial body."

"Color in Action"

Another "It was color in action, presenting transitions of color in this vicinity." "About 100 feet from me."

"Right of Lifetime"

The view of a blazing fireball is said to be the "right of a lifetime" only one per person. Some who have never seen "theirs" doubt such phenomena. A man enthusiastically reporting to his house guests what he had just observed, was dryly told, "You likely just saw a fireball."

Warned by Husband

One woman wrote that her husband warned her not to tell anyone. "Your name will be in the papers as a flying saucer addict."

Thirty-six hours later

when she picked up her Sunday paper from the front porch, she was restored to normalcy for she read that hundreds of others had suffered exactly the same hallucination that distracting evening.

Major Problems in Twin Falls Are Outlined in Address by City Manager

 The form of government now in vogue in Twin Falls is being discussed by the city manager in a series of addresses to the city council. The city manager, in his address, said that a regularity will be maintained in the city's revenues must be made in accordance with the city getting a first class rating under the 1930 census figures. Cities with populations in excess of 10,000 are required to submit reports from the state—then 60 smaller cities. He said that the city of Twin Falls is now receiving \$100,000 from the state highway department this year and that revenue will be discussed in future weeks.

In the control of revenues and budgeting, Smith pointed out that monthly revenue reports and reports on expenditure items are used in making out the quarterly budget allotments for each department. "Actual expenses and allocated expenditures are compared," he explained. He pointed out that the first quarter 1930 budget was \$100,000 but only \$176,000 was spent and all plans were carried out.

Planning and zoning commission problems also were discussed. He called the planning and zoning commission the city's most important group next to the city commission. He said the commission does the overall planning for the city and consists of four committees. These are the zoning committee (staff), the field committee to study zoning problems and specifications such as dimensions for streets and alleys, a committee to plan and secure parks and recreation areas and a zoning variance committee to hold public hearings when questions arise in zoning rulings. All committees have been formed under the present city administration.

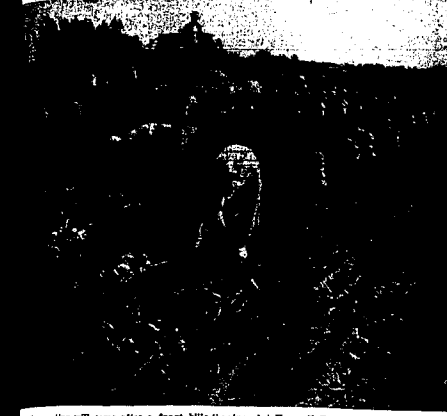

Machines and Early Plantings Bring Spud Harvest End for Filer Farmer

FILER, Sept. 16—Mechanization has been the only reason Homer F. Ramseyer is a fitter ahead on the potato harvest. It's just finishing three weeks of harvesting here.

Most early potatoes such as the Blue Triumph or Early Ohio were harvested three weeks to a month ago. And the late tubers like the famous Idaho Blue are now ready for harvesting until frost kills the vines.

Ramseyer answers to why he's harvesting now is simply, "I plant early and harvest early." He says he has 100-1200 later tubers, three miles north of Filer. He says the harvest has been going well on the 74 acres he has in spuds this year. The yield is topping 400 sacks per acre, and his crew of 40 men and women harvest

about five acres per day and pack as many as 1215 100-pound sacks per day.

Mechanization is evident in all his operations from power diggers in the field to an assembly line process of unloading, washing, sorting and packing the sacks which

proceeds them are the finest Magic Valley controlled quality Idaho potatoes.

Ramseyer says his spuds are being shipped to all parts of the country. Thursday, two vans from Phoenix, Ariz., were loaded with 300 sacks each, and Ramseyer says they'll be gone for more of Idaho's famous product.

Cold Midwest Weather May Up Meat Cost

WASHINGTON, Sept. 18 (AP)—The weather is threatening to keep a lot of beef away from butcher shops this fall and winter—and to hold meat prices higher than they otherwise might be.

The summer corn belt has started cool and wet—preventing proper development and ripening of corn for the killing months of 1936.

"A reducing crop may mean a shortage of meat," says a livestock expert. "If that is true, it would be otherwise also not necessarily mean there will be no reduction in prices. That is, if H. E. Read, director of the livestock and marketing administration, has predicted moderate declines in the killing months of 1936.

Farmers buy feeders.

Faced with the prospect that large quantities of corn may not be harvested properly before frost, many farmers are rushing out to buy cattle to feed the prospective "soft" corn in doing so. They are competing with slaughterers for cattle which otherwise would be killed now.

"Soft" corn cannot be stored for long and cannot be sold, except at a sharp price discount. Neither is it eligible for government price support loans.

Only Probable Return

Consequently, return the only way a farmer can get anything out of this immature corn is to feed it as soon as possible to meat animals and hope for a partial return from the livestock will give him something for his grain.

The demand for cattle for feeding in the corn belt has been very strong during the past week of heavy buying of cattle from western ranges—mostly by packers to meet consumer needs and by farmers for feeding—has sent prices to record levels for the year.

From the consumer's standpoint, diversion of cattle from slaughter to feed is desirable, since the means has been in the months immediately ahead. But it will mean a heavier package next year than otherwise would be the case.

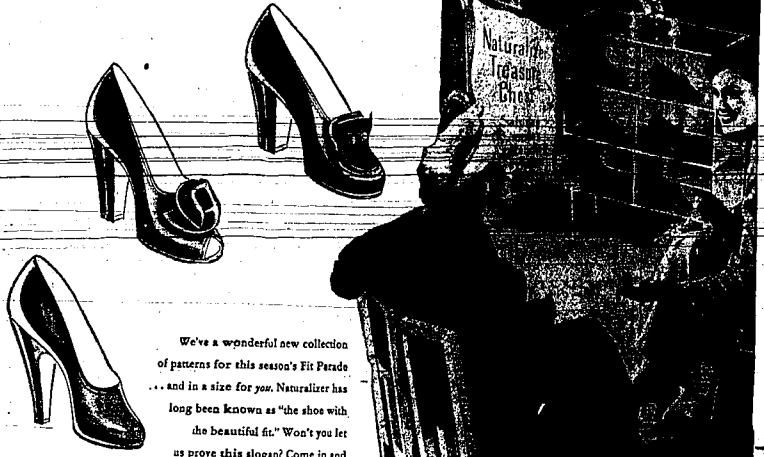
