The new building will be with modern red brick, with light buff mortar. Plans call for a steam plant and a steam plant and educational building.

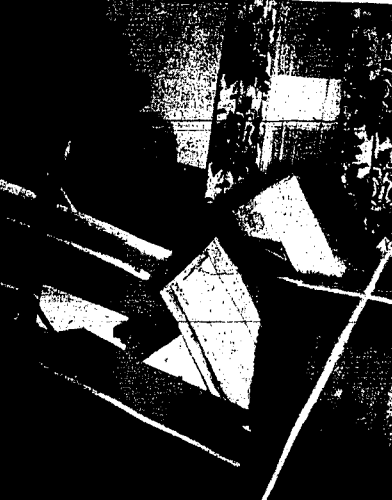

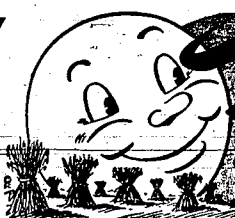
